NEXT NORTON SOUND COMMERCIAL SALMON OPENINGS

Commercial salmon fishing will open for 16 hours, from 8 a.m. until 12 midnight on July 5 through July 8, in Norton Sound Subdistricts 2, 3 and 4, the Golovin, Elim and Norton Bay Subdistricts, except Golovin Subdistrict will be closed to fishing Tuesday, July 5, Norton Bay Subdistrict will be closed to fishing, Wednesday, July 6 and Elim Subdistrict will be closed to fishing on Thursday, July 7.

Commercial fishing will be open for 10 hours, from 2 p.m. to 12 midnight, on Tuesday, July 5 in Norton Sound Subdistricts 5 and 6, the Shaktoolik and Unalakleet Subdistricts.

For all subdistricts gillnets are limited to 6 inches or less and 100 fathoms in length.

Fishermen are encouraged to contact the buyer before fishing and during the fishing periods to make sure buying operations have not been suspended because of capacity concerns. The commercial catch of over 11,000 pinks during the last fishing period in Unalakleet outnumbered the chum catch by 13 to 1. The department is working with the buyer on setting fishing openings that work best for their capacity and quality concerns in each subdistrict.
