## CHIGNIK WEIR SOCKEYE SALMON STOCK COMPOSITION SUMMARY #2 July 2, 2016

This is the Alaska Department of Fish and Game with an update regarding genetic stock composition estimates for sockeye salmon from the Chignik River weir for July 2, 2016. A total of 190 fish were sampled and genotyped, however only 156 fish had adequate genotypes to include in the mixture. We are uncertain why some fish failed to adequately amplify for genotyping; however, we are confident in the 156 fish with quality genotypes. Although the credibility intervals are higher with this smaller sample size, we think there is value in releasing in-season estimates based on a sample size of 156 fish to distinguish between two reporting groups (early and late-run).

Samples were collected at the Chignik weir and analyzed at the Gene Conservation Laboratory by Commercial Fisheries Division staff. These results are in-season estimates and are therefore preliminary in nature.
