**2016 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 39  
Yukon River District 1 Commercial Period 14  
Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area  
Emergency Order # 34**

**District 1 Commercial Fishing:**

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in the **Set Net Only Area** of District Y-1 on Tuesday, August 23 from 1:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. This will be a 9-hour commercial fishing period for the **Set Net Only Area** with gillnets restricted to six-inch or smaller mesh.

The remainder of District Y-1 will be open to commercial fishing on Tuesday, August 23 from 3:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. This will be a 6-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to six-inch or smaller mesh.

Verbal reports from the District 1 commercial opening on August 21 indicate a preliminary harvest of 20,154 fall chum and 18,150 coho salmon. The cumulative commercial harvest in District 1 to date is 184,574 fall chum and 43,730 coho salmon.

**District 1 Subsistence Fishing:**

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 1 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for 12 hours before, during, and 12 hours after each commercial fishing period. **For this short notice period, subsistence salmon fishing in District 1 will close at 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 23, and reopen at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 24.** Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
