SOUTHEAST ALASKA/YAKUTAT SPRING TROLL FISHERY

Sitka . . . The Alaska Department of Fish and Game announced today the following information concerning the commercial spring troll fishery.

The following terminal harvest areas (THA) will remain open until further notice:

Neets Bay THA (101-95), Anita Bay THA (107-35), Port Armstrong THA (109-11), and Hidden Falls THA (112-22).

Opening times and dates for other spring areas will be announced in a future new release. Maps and further details are provided in the 2017 Spring Troll Management Plan, which is available in area offices and online.

Reminder for trollers in the Chatham Strait fishery near Kake: the waters of Keku Strait enclosed by a line from a point about one-third mile northwest of Kake at 56°58.95′ N. lat., 133°57.42′ W. long. to the southernmost tip of the southern Mosquito Island to the northwest tip of Hamilton Island to Wooten's Dock at 56°57.55′ N. lat., 133°54.70′ W. long., as described in 5 AAC 40.071(a), are closed.

It is extremely important to keep fish caught in different fishery areas separated so that accurate dockside sampling can occur by department personnel. If more than one area is fished, each troller and tender is required to keep and report these catches separately on separate fish tickets [5 AAC 29.090(k)]. The fishery name and the fishery area number must be reported on all fish tickets.
