EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in the following portions of hunt area RG150; (1) that portion including Blue Lake, Glacier Lake drainages, (2) that portion including Medvejie Lake, Bear Lake, Indigo Lake drainages , and drainages into the east side of Silver Bay between Bear Cove and Manit point, and (3) that portion of the south Katlian River drainage including all drainages into the south side of Katlian Bay, including the drainage south of the south bank of the Katlian River, and that portion south of the south bank of the mainstem stream draining into and out of Hogan Lake on Baranof Island in Game Management Unit 4. This emergency order takes effect at 11:59 PM, July 7, 2011.

JUSTIFICATION:

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in a portion of hunt area RG150; (1) that portion including Blue Lake, Glacier Lake drainages, (2) that portion including Medvejie Lake, Bear Lake, Indigo Lake drainages, and drainages into the east side of Silver Bay between Bear Cove and Manit point, and (3) that portion of the south Katlian River drainage including all drainages into the south side of Katlian Bay, including the drainage south of the south bank of the Katlian River; and that portion south of the south bank of the mainstem stream draining into and out of Hogan Lake on Baranof Island in Game Management Unit 4. Since 2006, biologists have documented a sustained mountain goat population decline in these areas based on aerial survey data. This decline is attributed to two main factors: a series of severe winters and a high harvest of female goats by hunters which have lowered the productivity of this goat herd. Nearly 66% of the goat population occurs on the northern half of Baranof Island and the core area within it (approximately 25% of that area) produces more than 60% of the goat harvest. This localized harvest intensity especially on female goats led to the concerns we now face. Biologists have documented an increasing age structure of harvested female goats over time, which suggests that younger females are not as available as in the past. These concerns are further exacerbated with recent research data from collared goats near Sitka that reveals high fidelity by

goats to small home ranges which would compromise a depleted population from rebounding quickly. This series of factors has led biologists to believe closing the goat season in these areas to be a necessary action to prevent further harvest and to allow this goat population to recover.

The emergency order action is necessary to prevent overharvest in this crucial area, achieve guideline harvest levels for the hunt area and provide for recruitment to stabilize the population decline.
