EXPLANATION:

This emergency order changes the bag limit for the Moose Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest hunt (CM300) in Game Management Unit 13B, that portion of the unit within 5 miles of the Denali Highway (between the Susitna River and Paxson), from one bull moose, to one bull moose with spike-fork antlers or 50" antlers or antlers with 4 or more brow tines on one side.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.045 (9-11)**, **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Moose**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Units and Bag Limits

(11) Unit 13

. . .

1 moose per regulatory year, only as follows:

RESIDENT HUNTERS:

1 bull with spike-fork antlers or 50-inch antlers or antlers with 4 or more brow Aug. 13 – Sept. 20 (Subsistence hunt only)

Resident Open Season (Subsistence and General Hunts)

Nonresident Open Season tines on one side per harvest report by community harvest permit in that portion of Unit 13B within 5 miles of the Denali Highway; or

JUSTIFICATION:

Prior to the hunt, it was established that up to 6 "any-bull" moose could be taken in the Copper Basin community hunt for Unit 13B, that portion within 5 miles of the Denali Highway. This limit was established based on sustainable harvest principles and current population estimates. 'Any-bulls' are those bull moose that do not meet state general hunt antler restrictions. Due to the number of community hunt moose harvest tickets issued, this quota of 6 "any-bull" moose is expected to be reached by Friday night.

Copper Basin community moose hunters may still hunt in this portion of Unit 13B through the end of the regularly scheduled season (September 20th) however, all bulls taken after Friday August 12th with a community harvest ticket must meet state general hunt antler restrictions (spike-fork antlers or 50" antlers or antlers with 4 or more brow tines on one side).

The Board of Game allocated up to 70 total "any-bull" moose to the Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Hunt for 2011-12. The following table lists the areas where the "any-bull" moose could be taken, and the general season antler restrictions for each area. Due to the change in 13B, that portion within 5 miles of the Denali Highway, the remaining allocation is 64 "any-bulls". Up to 54 can be taken in remaining portions of Unit 13, and up to 10 can be taken in Unit 11. All other state hunting regulations still apply, including the closure of the take of all big game in the Paxson Closed Area.
