EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the fall portion (September 15, 2012, through November 30, 2012) of the 2012/13 brown bear drawing permit hunts (DB301, DB303, DB305, DB307 and DB309) and the 2012 (October 1, 2012, through November 30, 2012) registration permit hunt (RB300) in Game Management Units 7 and 15 on the Kenai Peninsula effective 11:59 October 10 and reopens the same permit hunts at 12:01 am October 25 if all human-caused mortalities have not exceeded 10 reproductive-age female bears from January 1 through October 25 based on a three year average. People who received a drawing permit (DB301, DB303, DB305, DB307, or DB309) will also be allowed to hunt during the adjusted fall hunt and the spring portion (April 1, 2013, through June 15, 2013) provided they did not harvest a brown bear this fall. All other brown bear hunting regulations are not affected by this emergency order.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.020 (6) and (14), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Brown Bear**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department manages brown bear harvest on the Kenai Peninsula so that all human-caused mortalities do not exceed 10 reproductive-age female bears from January 1 through December 31. Human-caused mortality includes defense-of-life-or-property kills, automobile collisions, illegally taken brown bears, hunter kills, and management-related deaths. From January 1, through October 9, 2012, documented human-caused mortalities for reproductive-age female brown bears on the Kenai Peninsula have reached 11. Therefore, the fall 2012 brown bear hunting season for drawing hunts DB301, DB303, DB305, DB307, and DB309 and registration hunt RB300 are closed by emergency order.

Given the Board of Game direction to manage on a 3-year average the Department will use some management flexibility to adjust the fall season dates. Most female bears will be in their dens by late October and the Department will reopen the brown bear season to allow additional opportunity for hunters to target male bears. This season will reopen on October 25 at 12:01 am and is currently planned to continue through November 30 or until 10 human-caused mortalities of reproductive age female brown bears based on a 3 year average have occurred.

Drawing permit holders (DB301, DB303, DB305, DB307, and DB309) will also be able to hunt the adjusted fall season and during the spring (April 1, 2013, through June 15, 2013) provided they did not harvest a bear this fall.
