EXPLANATION:

This emergency order opens the State of Alaska winter hunting season for moose in Game Management Unit 17(A) from January 7–31. The bag limit for the winter season in Unit 17(A) hunt is two moose. The cow season will be closed by Emergency Order when the harvest quota of ten cow moose has been reached. Hunters are allowed to harvest one bull moose with a RM575 registration permit (bull permit) and/or one cow with a RM576 registration permit (cow permit). Hunters who have already taken a moose in the fall are only allowed to harvest one additional moose (either sex). Permits will be available only at the Dillingham ADF&G office and Togiak Traditional Council office. This emergency order does not affect any other moose hunting regulations in Unit 17.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.045(15)**, **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Moose**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

The Alaska Board of Game and Federal Subsistence Board authorized a winter moose hunting season of up to 31 days in Unit 17(A) with a bag limit of up to two moose. Winter travel conditions are generally improving, and the hunt can be offered with reasonable opportunity for hunters to access the area. Aerial surveys indicated that there were at least 1,166 moose in Unit 17(A) with a bull ratio of 66 bulls:100 cows when the population was surveyed in March 2011. High rates of moose calf production and survival observed since the survey indicate that the population can sustain the harvest of 10 cow moose annually. The department will issue an Emergency Order to close the cow season when the harvest quota of 10 cow moose has been reached.
