EXPLANATION:

This emergency order establishes the season for state **nonresident** registration permit hunt RG882 for mountain goats in Unit 14(C) as September 1-3, 2015. All other goat hunting seasons in Unit 14 are unaffected by this emergency order.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in 5AAC 85.040(7), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits** for Goats, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective for hunting goats:

> Resident **Open Season** (Subsistence and **General Hunts**)

Nonresident Open Season

Units and Bag Limits

Remainder of Unit 14(C); specifically that portion within the drainages of Knik River upstream from, but not including Big Timber Creek drainage

NONRESIDENT HUNTERS:

RG879 Aug. 16-Aug. 31

1 goat by registration permit only, and by bow and arrow only; the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited;

or

RG 882 Sept. 1- Sept. 3

1 goat by registration permit only; the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited.

All other goat hunting regulations in Unit 14 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

Goat surveys were conducted in the Lake George area in summer 2015 with 471 goats counted. The department's area management objectives provide for a sustainable annual harvest of 5 percent comprised of at least 60 percent billies. To maintain that goal, the Lake George registration hunt area has been assigned a maximum allowable harvest of 23 "goat units". Total goat units are calculated using one unit for billies and two for nannies. The Lake George area is managed with separate registration hunts for resident and nonresident hunters. Fourteen of the total goat units are allotted for residents holding permit RG869 and three goat units are allotted for nonresidents holding permit RG882. Total goat units are calculated using one unit for billies and two units for nannies. To minimize the likelihood that the quota for RG882 is not exceeded, this hunt will close at 11:59 pm on 3 September 2015.
