### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order changes the bag limit for the Moose Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Hunt (CM300) in Game Management Unit 13B, from one bull moose, to one bull moose with spike-fork antlers, or 50 inch antlers, or antlers with four or more brow tines on one side.

#### **REGULATION:**

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.045** (11), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Moose**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Unit 13

1 moose per regulatory year, only as follows:

**RESIDENT HUNTERS:** 

1 bull with spike-fork antlers or 50-inch antlers or antlers with 4 or more brow tines on one side per harvest report by community harvest

Sept. 9 – Sept. 20 (Subsistence hunt only) permit only in Unit 13D and 13E; or

<u>1 bull with spike-fork</u> <u>antlers or 50-inch antlers or</u> <u>antlers with 4 or more brow</u> <u>tines on one side per harvest</u> <u>report by community harvest</u> <u>permit only in Unit 13B</u>; or

1 bull per harvest report by community harvest permit only in Units 13A East, 13C, and Unit 11; however, no more than 100 bulls that do not meet antler restrictions for other resident hunts in the same area may be taken in the entire community harvest area; or <u>Sept. 14</u> – Sept. 20 (Subsistence hunt only)

Aug. 10 – Sept. 20 (Subsistence hunt only)

#### JUSTIFICATION:

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Prior to the hunt, a quota of thirty bull moose that do not conform with the general season antler restrictions was established for the Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Hunt (CM300) in Game Management Unit 13B. The quotas for Units 13B, 13D, and 13E, based on sustainable harvest principles and current population estimates, have been reached.

Copper Basin community moose hunters can still hunt moose in Units 13B, 13D, and 13E through the end of the regularly scheduled season (September 20), however all bulls taken must conform to the general hunt antler restrictions (spike-fork antlers or 50-inch antlers or antlers with four or more brow tines on one side).

The Board of Game allocated up to 100 moose that do not conform to general season antler restrictions to the Copper Basin Community Subsistence Harvest Hunt. The cumulative total for quotas for the 2015-16 season is 100 moose. The following table lists the quotas for each hunt area and the general season antler restrictions.

This emergency order changes only the bag limit in Unit 13B. Bulls that do not meet the general season antler restrictions can still be taken in the remaining open subunits of Unit 13,

per the table below. All other state hunting regulations still apply, including the closure of the take of all big game in the Paxson Closed Area.
