## **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order closes the State of Alaska resident and nonresident hunting season for mountain goat in registration permit hunt RG248, north of the Port of Valdez in Game Management Unit 6(D). The hunt area includes the mainland drainages of Sheep Creek; north of Port Valdez, Robe Lake, and the Richardson Highway; and east of Shoup Glacier. Mountain goat hunting regulations in all other portions of Game Management Unit 6 are not affected by this emergency order.

#### **REGULATION:**

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.040** (2), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Goat**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

### **JUSTIFICATION:**

An aerial survey conducted this year resulted in a minimum count of 162 goats within the RG248 mountain goat hunt area. The department set the maximum allowable state harvest at five goat units. Each billy counts as one goat unit, each nanny counts as two goat units, and each unrecoverable goat counts as one and one-half (1.5) goat units. Two billies and one nanny have been taken for a total or four goat units. Many hunters are currently in the field and it is likely that additional goats have been harvested and not yet reported. This closure is necessary to prevent unsustainable harvest.
