EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the State of Alaska hunting season under the Community Subsistence Harvest (CSH) household permit, CC001, for caribou in Unit 13 at 11:59 p.m. on February 23, 2017. By regulation up to 300 caribou may be taken per regulatory year and the quota has been reached. All other caribou hunting regulations in Unit13 remain unchanged by this emergency order.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.025** (**8**), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Caribou**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

To date, a total of 5,002 caribou (2,992 bulls and 2,096 cows) have been reported taken in the following state hunts: Tier I (2,992), community subsistence harvest (300), drawing (1,710). An additional 446 caribou have been harvested by federal subsistence hunters (281 bulls and 165 cows). The federal harvest has averaged 400 caribou annually over the past five years and remains open.

This emergency order only affects the community subsistence hunt (CC001). All other state hunting regulations still apply including the closure of the take of all big game in the Paxson Closed Area, and other restricted areas.
