#### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident goat hunting seasons in that area bounded by the East Fork of the Skagway River on the north side, Kasidaya Creek on the south side, Taiya Inlet, and the White Pass and Yukon Railroad on the west, and the Canadian border on the east, in Game Management Unit 1(D). This order takes effect at 11:59 pm, Friday, October 5, 2018.

#### **REGULATORY TEXT:**

Therefore, the provisions of 5 AAC 85.040, HUNTING SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS FOR GOAT, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective for hunting goat in Unit 1(D):

The remainder of Unit 1D mountain goat seasons, other than those previously closed by emergency order, are not affected by this emergency order.

#### JUSTIFICATION:

A guideline harvest objective of 1-2 points (male goats = 1point, female goats = 2point) was established for the area described above. As of Thursday, October 4, 2018 one male and one female goat have been harvested for a total of 3 points. Due to the vulnerability of goats in this area and because the guideline harvest level has been exceeded an emergency order has been issued. Those portions of Unit 1D not affected by this emergency order, and not previously closed by emergency order, will remain open until the harvest guidelines are reached or the seasons come to their scheduled conclusions. Biologists with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game encourage hunters to target male goats to allow for higher sustainable harvest.
