EXPLANATION:

This emergency order changes the bag limit for all state Nelchina caribou hunts in Game Management Unit 13 (i.e., RC561, RC562, CC001, YC495, and DC485) from one bull to one either sex caribou. This emergency order does not affect any other caribou hunting regulation in Unit 13.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.025** (a)(8)(B), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Caribou, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

All other caribou hunting regulations remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

To maintain the population objective of 35,000–40,000 Nelchina caribou, harvest quotas are modified annually. Information collected from collared caribou during the winter and spring indicate that the herd experienced high survival and high recruitment rates through the winter of 2018/2019. When the herd returned to the Nelchina Basin, calf productivity was high, which impacted overall herd size. The July 2019 post-calving survey of the herd is being finalized, but a minimum of 51,000 caribou have been identified, of which approximately 17,000 are calves and 34,000 are adults, which allows for a harvestable surplus that will accommodate harvest of both bulls and cows.
