### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order extends the season for all state Nelchina caribou hunts in Game Management Unit 13 (i.e., YC495, RC561, RC562, CC001, and DC485) to add additional opportunity from September 21<sup>st</sup> until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 11:59 pm. The bag limit for all hunts remains one caribou. This emergency order does not affect any other hunting regulation in Unit 13.

#### **REGULATION:**

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.025** (a) (8), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Caribou, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

The department's July 2019 post-calving survey identified a minimum of 53,500 caribou for the Nelchina caribou herd. Approximately 35,850 caribou are adults and 17,650 are calves this year. To maintain the population objective of 35,000–40,000 Nelchina caribou, the department will be extending the season to allow for additional harvest.
