EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the State of Alaska resident and nonresident hunting season for elk in the East Afognak hunt area RE755 (Unit 8) at 11:59 p.m., November 1, 2020. The area closing is part of the East Afognak hunt area of Unit 8, that portion of Afognak Island east of the main north-south logging road (1100 Road) from Danger Bay logging camp (58° 08.2' N, 152° 32.9'W) north to its terminus at Discoverer Bay (58° 19.6' N, 152° 21.8' W). Kodiak and Shuyak Islands will remain open.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5 AAC 85.035** (a) (2), **Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Elk**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

This emergency order closes the elk hunting season in the East Afognak registration permit hunt area RE755 on Afognak Island. This portion of the registration permit hunt area will be closed as of 11:59 p.m. on November 1, 2020. The elk herds comprising this portion of the hunt area are estimated to include a total 235 elk. To maintain a stable to slightly increasing population, a harvest target of 24 elk was established for the hunt area which also includes drawing hunts. As of October 30, 2020, the reported harvest in this area is 18 elk. With hunters still in the field this closure is necessary to prevent exceeding harvest objectives.
