EXPLANATION:

Caribou registration permit hunt RC503 for the Mulchatna caribou herd in portions of Game Management Units 9A, 9B, 9C, 17A, 17B, 17C, 18, 19A and 19B will open this year at 12:00 a.m. August 1, 2020 and will close on September 20. 2020 at 11:59 p.m. Permits will be available online (https://secure.wildlife.alaska.gov/ePermit), in person at ADF&G offices in Anchorage, Bethel, Dillingham, Fairbanks, Homer, King Salmon, McGrath, Palmer, Soldotna, and at license vendors within the hunt area beginning Monday, July 20, 2020. Hunters are encouraged to go online to get permits to reduce personal contact in offices. The bag limit is one bull caribou across the entire hunt area with a 5-day reporting requirement. The federal bag limit is also one bull under the RC503 permit. No winter season will be announced.

In addition, the state-administered RC501 hunt for Nushagak Peninsula caribou will not open this year due to reduced herd size This does not affect the federal subsistence hunt for Nushagak Peninsula caribou. Federal managers will announce 2020 federal subsistence hunting regulations for Nushagak Peninsula caribou after consultation with the Nushagak Peninsula Caribou Planning Committee.

All other caribou hunting regulations for Units 9, 17, 18 and 19 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

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JUSTIFICATION:

The RC503 permit area covers the range the Mulchatna caribou herd in portions of Units 9, 17, 18 and 19. The population of Mulchatna caribou herd has been estimated at approximately 13,500 animals for the past two years and remains below the population objective of 30,000-80,000 caribou and continued management action must take place for the conservation of the herd In August 2019, the department took conservation measures by reducing the bag limit from 2 caribou to 1 caribou (EO 04-06-19) and later closing the hunt entirely on January 31, 2020 after stakeholder consultation.

This year (RY2020) a limited number of bull caribou are available are for harvest. The bag limit for caribou has been reduced to one bull caribou with season dates of August 1-September 20 only. RC503 hunt permit reports are due within 5 days of a successful harvest or 15 days after close of season for unsuccessful hunts or those that did not hunt.

State caribou hunting opportunities on the Nushagak Peninsula (RC501) are closed this year due to a reduction needed to manage the population. Federal hunting opportunity on the Nushagak Peninsula remains.

State caribou hunting opportunities under general harvest for caribou remain in Units 9D, 10, 19C and 19D.
