### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order extends the season for all state Nelchina caribou hunts in Game Management Unit 13 (i.e., YC495, RC561, RC562, CC001, DC475, and DC485) to add additional opportunity from September 21<sup>st</sup> until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 11:59 pm. The bag limit for all resident hunts remains one caribou. The bag limit for nonresident hunts remains one bull caribou. This emergency order does not affect any other hunting regulation in Unit 13.

#### **REGULATION:**

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.025** (a) (8), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Caribou, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

The department's July 2020 abundance estimate for the Nelchina caribou herd was 44,500 animals. Quotas were established based on harvestable surplus and anticipated harvest from 2020 permitholders. To maintain the population objective of 35,000–40,000 Nelchina caribou, the department will be extending the season to allow for additional harvest to meet harvest objectives and to maintain a healthy herd. This season extension will also provide additional opportunity to hunters impacted by the federal closure of federal lands in GMUs 13A and 13B.
