### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in the Hogan Lake zone of RG150 on Baranof Island in Game Management Unit 4. This emergency order takes effect at 11:59 PM, Friday, December 23, 2022.

#### **<u>REGULATION</u>**:

Therefore, the provisions of **5 AAC 85.040, Hunting seasons and bag limits for goat**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Units and Bag Limits	Resident Open Season (Subsistence and General Hunts	Nonresident Open Season
 Unit 4, Hogan Lake - All drainages of Hogan Lake/Creek.	Aug. 1 – Dec. 23 (General hunt only)	Aug. 1 – Dec. 23

1 goat by registration permit only, the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited.

All other mountain goat hunting regulations in Unit 4 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

#### JUSTIFICATION:

Hunt managers set a harvest quota of 5 males or 1 female for the Hogan Lake hunt zone of mountain goat hunt RG150 on Baranof Island. Quotas are based on the most recent aerial surveys. Fifty goats were observed in this zone during an October 2022 survey. In 2011, hunt managers devised the strategy of closing hunt zones when one female goat was harvested. This strategy has been very effective in reducing female harvest. This "one and done" policy not only reduces female harvest in areas where there may be population concerns, but helps maintain high harvest opportunities for male goats. Keeping hunters focused on avoiding female harvest maintains opportunities for more hunters to participate, especially in hunt zones that have good access.

To date, two female goats have been harvested in the Hogan Lake hunt zone of RG150. The management objective for this zone has been exceeded and no further harvest is warranted. Additional harvest could lead to reduced hunting opportunities in the future. Therefore, this zone is being closed by emergency order.
