State Closes Winter Antlered Bull Hunt: Unit 22B West of Darby Mountains

(Nome) – The Alaska Department of Fish and Game announces an emergency order to close the State resident moose season in hunt area Unit 22(B), that portion west of the Darby Mountains, by registration permit hunt RM843 (*Note: this area is identified as the Remainder of Unit 22(B) in the hunting regulations booklet*) at 11:59pm on January 13, 2020. The area affected by this emergency order includes all drainages in Unit 22(B) west of the Darby Mountains.

The western Unit 22(B) moose population has remained stable at a low density (≤ 0.25 moose/mi²) with recruitment rates at or below 10% between 1999 and 2013. The department completed a spring GSPE abundance survey in March 2016 and found an estimate of 728 observable moose (609-847 at 90% C.I.), and a recruitment rate of 14% short yearlings. The Alaska Board of Game established a moose registration permit hunt in western Unit 22(B) and the department set an annual harvest quota of 34 bulls based on results from the 2016 spring GSPE moose abundance survey. The fall season closed Sept. 6, 2019 with a reported harvest of 27 bull moose. The winter season, RM843, opened January 1, 2020 with a harvest quota of 7 antlered bulls. The harvest is expected to be met by the closing date announced in this emergency order and no further harvest is warranted.

All other moose hunting regulations in Unit 22 remain unchanged by this emergency order.
