For those of you who enjoy numbers and success stories, then the Winter newsletter is for you. This edition contains the 2018 stats, instructor longevity recognition, and Instructor of the Year recipients.

HIT Program certification courses were taught in **44 different cities and villages** during 2018 and we had **503 active volunteer instructors**.

2018 HIT Program Instructor of the Year Awards

Volunteer instructors are the backbone of the HIT Program. They are connected to their communities and through their efforts reach more students. Volunteer instructors as a group possess a vast wealth of information which has proven to be invaluable in passing on the knowledge and skills of the outdoors. Through the countless hours of donated teaching time, thousands of students have been taught lessons of responsibility, conservation, firearms safety, and safety in the outdoors. The HIT Program would like to recognize the following volunteer instructors for making a significant contribution to the HIT Program and considerably advancing the cause of safe/ethical hunting.

Lifetime Achievement-Richard Sterling of Fairbanks



Rick has been a hunter ed instructor since 2003 and a muzzleloader ed instructor since 2011. During his time with the HIT Program, he has taught 125 classes and certified 1,832 students. In 2018, he instructed all 16 hunter ed classes offered in Fairbanks. Rick has sat on the HIT Program Steering Group, played an active role in the Youth Hunter Education Challenge (YHEC), and on the Alaska Interior Marksmanship Committee (AIM-COMM). Rick can always be counted on to fill a vacant instructor slot and is recognized as a "go-to" instructor in the Fairbanks area. He has significantly assisted the HIT Program by mentoring new instructors so they're able to step up as lead instructors themselves, and he creates a strong social bond amongst instructors which encourages continuing participation and commitment to the program.

Lifetime Achievement-Richard Groff of Cordova

Dick has been a hunter ed instructor since 1998. He has instructed every instructor-led course offered in Cordova since 2003 (this is when our course database starts) and has certified at least 238 students. The Cordova community courses are completed over a matter of weeks and the instructors go more in-depth on each topic. On average, the instructors spend 20+ hours instructing each course. He has also been actively involved as a volunteer for the Cordova Trap and Gun Club. Dick was recently honored by the City of Cordova for his years of community service, and at age 83 is believed to be the oldest active firefighter in the state. He is the embodiment of the HIT Program mission and his efforts as an instructor an mentor have helped provide Alaskans with the skills and knowledge needed to be safe, responsible hunters.

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Instructor Notes

Hunter Education Instructor of the Year-Richard Graham of Wasilla



Rich has been a hunter ed instructor since 2004 and a bowhunter ed instructor since 2006. He taught 10 classes in 2018, and over the years has taught 84 classes and certified 1,579 students. Rich can always be counted on to step in when an extra instructor is needed for classes and he helps out with other HIT Program activities throughout the year. Rich acts as a great ambassador for the program at the Mat-Su Outdoorsman Show,

the Anchorage Great Alaska Sportsman's Show, Potter Marsh Discovery Day, and Outdoor Youth Days. During the 2018 IHEA-USA Conference he led conference attendees on the hunter ed field course so they could experience what our hunter ed students learn.

Outstanding Educator of the Year-Robert Taylor of Fairbanks

Rob has been a hunter ed and bowhunter ed instructor since 2010, a muzzleloader ed instructor since 2011, and a crossbow ed instructor since 2017. Since becoming an instructor, Rob has taught 74 classes certifying 1,107 students. In 2018 Rob taught 13 classes, including helping to instruct a women's-only hunter ed class in Fairbanks for the first time. Rob was also the 2011 muzzleloader ed instructor of the year. Rob's easygoing teaching style makes him a favorite with students.



Bowhunter Education Instructor of the Year-Ryan Adam of North Pole



Ryan is new to our instructor ranks as he became certified to instruct hunter ed, bowhunter ed, and crossbow ed in 2018. He jumped in with both feet and taught 5 bowhunter ed and 4 crossbow ed classes in his first year. His enthusiasm for the subject shows, and both instructors and students alike enjoy being in a classroom with him. He

wasn't afraid to step right in and teach alongside longtime instructors, and "isn't scared of paperwork."
