PROJECT TITLE: The Status of Alaska Dall Sheep and Factors Influencing Their Populations

REPORT DESCRIPTION: This performance report describes Dall sheep survey and inventory

activities. Activities are listed by game management unit.

Region II Activities:

ACTIVITY: Monitor the sheep harvest through field observations, hunter harvest reports and contact with hunters.

Information was collected during interviews with hunters and from information provided on harvest tickets. See area specific activities for additional information.

ACTIVITY: Collect data from sheep presented for sealing by hunters.

All full curl and some ewe sheep taken in Region II were presented to staff for measuring and sealing. See area specific activities for additional information.

ACTIVITY: Survey selected sheep areas to determine distribution, sex and age.

Surveys were completed in selected hunt areas within individual GMUs. See Area specific activities.

ACTIVITY: A new full time position will work with area biologists to determine research needs in the region.

In addition to research commitments the Sheep biologist works with and advises Area staff with sheep related management decisions. Research biologist prepared and presented information to Board of Game relative to regional sheep management.

ACTIVITY: Draft a triennial Dall sheep management report.

Dall sheep management report was not due during this period. Staff continued to collect information in preparation for drafting next report.

Activities by Unit:

Units 7&15

ACTIVITY 1: Monitor the sheep harvest through field observations, hunter harvest reports and contact with hunters.

Eleven rams were taken during the general season with 44 people reported hunting. Two additional rams were taken during drawing permit hunts.

ACTIVITY: Collect data from sheep presented for sealing by hunters.

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All sheep taken were presented for measuring and sealing. For general season hunts the average horn length was 35.8 inches (range 34.25-38.25) and the average age was 8.6 years (range 7-10). Two sheep only measured 7/8 curl, but they were both 9 years old.

ACTIVITY 2: Survey selected sheep areas to determine distribution, sex and age. Eight count areas were surveyed resulting in the classification of 205 sheep. The composition was 56 rams, 111 ewes and small rams, and 38 lambs.

Unit 14C

ACTIVITY 1: Sheep harvest was monitored through hunter harvest reports and sealing records. Harvest for GMU 14C was: 16 full curl rams. Sheep horn size, sheep age and location of kill was collected from sheep horns and interviews with hunters at the time of sealing.

<u>ACTIVITY 2:</u> Sheep surveys were conducted throughout most sheep habitat in GMU 14C. We counted 1,050 sheep including 42 full curl rams, 289 < full curl rams, 4 unclassified rams, 599 ewes, and 116 lambs.

ACTIVITY 3: Research was initiated in GMU 14C to determine productivity and mortality. Results will be reported under a separate project.

ACTIVITY 1: Conduct aerial composition surveys to monitor population trends.

Conducted aerial composition surveys in the White Mountains, Tanana Hills, Delta Controlled Use Area, Central Alaska Range, Tok Management Area and observed approximately 4,500 sheep.

ACTIVITY 2: Monitor the harvest through hunter contacts and harvest or permit reports and analyze harvest data.

Monitored preliminary harvest of 598 sheep through hunter contacts and harvest or permit reports and analyzed harvest data.

ACTIVITY 3: Provide Dall sheep management information to State and Federal regulatory processes.

Provided information to 15 State fish and game advisory committees and 2 Federal regional advisory councils.

ACTIVITY 3: Prepare Dall sheep management reports.

Region V Activities:

ACTIVITY 1: Provide information to State and Federal regulatory processes on Dall sheep management.

Area management staff reviewed State and Federal regulatory proposals, attended regulatory process meetings, and presented Dall sheep information to the State Board of Game, State Fish and Game Advisory Committees, Federal Subsistence Board, and Federal Subsistence Regional Advisory Councils.

Mountain Range or Use Area Activities:

Baird Mountains:

ACTIVITY 1: Assist NPS with aerial surveys in established count areas as needed.

No surveys were scheduled during the reporting period. Surveys were conducted by NPS in July 2011 using a distance sampling technique but conflicting fieldwork prevented ADF&G involvement.

ACTIVITY 2: Monitor the population by conducting minimum counts or generating population estimates with survey data.

No surveys were conducted this year due to conflicts with the schedule established by NPS.

DeLong Mountains:

ACTIVITY 1: Monitor harvests through the harvest ticket system, permit hunts, Community-based Harvest Assessments, public contacts and field observations.

Eleven drawing permits were issued to hunters for the fall 2011 hunting season; eventually all reported their activity; 3 rams were taken in the drawing hunt. Fifteen hunters registered to hunt in Hunt RS388 and 1sheep was taken (1 ewe). No harvest information was available from federal sheep hunts.

ACTIVITY 2: Assist NPS with aerial surveys as needed.

Surveys were conducted by NPS in July 2011 (after the reporting period) using a distance sampling technique but conflicting fieldwork prevented ADF&G involvement. No surveys were conducted in 2012.

ACTIVITY 3: Monitor the population by conducting minimum counts or generating population estimates with survey data.

The data collected in 2011 by the NPS generated an estimate of 592 sheep \pm about 200 sheep. Using that point estimate, the sheep population is down 35% from the minimum count in 2009. However, it's important to note that the two survey techniques are not comparable.

ACTIVITY 4: Assess population and composition in years when NPS is not surveying the area. No additional surveys were conducted this year.

Schwatka Mountains:

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ACTIVITY 1: Monitor harvests through the harvest ticket system, permit hunts, community-based harvest assessments, public contacts and field observations.

No sheep were taken by registration permit hunt RS389 or in the general season hunt. No harvest information was available from federal sheep hunts.
