Adjust Northern District Salmon Management Plan in such a way as to provide a high likelihood ANCHORAGE that sockeye salmon escapement counts through the Yentna River Sonar can be projected as meeting or exceeding the midpoint of the sockeye salmon escapement goal range by July 23 two out of every three years between board meetings.

Needed specific language in management plans to provide allocations for all users in Upper Cook Inlet - without specific language the commercial manager makes allocation decisions that affect all user groups in Upper Cook Inlet. Aside from early and late run king salmon and coho salmon most available fish are allocated entirely to the commercial fishery without specific language. Without specific language, the commercial fleet is allowed to harvest all of the available harvest as long as escapement goals are met -- limited only by the commercial fleet's ability to harvest those fish.

Achieving mid range escapements to all systems takes priority over harvesting salmon in a mixed stock fishery to avoid Sustainable Escapement Goal (SEG) over escapements of salmon into specific stream systems. Something lacking in Upper Cook Inlet has been escapements of salmon so large that they do not reproduce themselves. Such escapements are needed to obtain Biological Escapement Goal (BEG) escapement determinations -- without BEG ranges defining the upper and lower bounds of desirable escapements -- thus, excessive harvesting of fish based on current SEGs could have a detrimental or less than desirable effect which could minimize rather than maximize benefits from Upper Cook Inlet fisheries.

Provide high enough numbers of sockeye returning to Yentna / Northern area so that Fish Creek personal use sockeye salmon fishery has some type of yearly allocation and / or July sport fishing opportunity. Without specific language there has been no personal use fishery for Fish Creek sockeye in XX years - there is also no sport salmon fishery during the entire month of July in Fish Creek.

Since the Departments ability to predict escapements to specific river systems only obtains accuracy after July 23 on most years, ADF&G should manage the Inlet on a conservative basis until at least that date. If inseason data after July 23 indicates surplus harvestable salmon are available, then extra commercial harvest opportunity may be allowed -- but only where it does not interfere with obtaining midpoint escapement ranges throughout Upper Cook Inlet on most years.

Subsistence fishery harvests on Yentna River have been shorted because of lack of escapement -- The Yentna / Susilna sockeye sport harvest has also been closed during several recent years. Both of these fisheries need specific language within management plan(s) to ensure enough sockeye salmon reach the river system to provide a subsistence and sport fishery without robbing from the identified sockeye salmon escapement goal range.

Request a review of the allocation criteria for all salmon management plans in light of the current economic situation. The price of commercial caught salmon has dropped significantly since this was last done, while at the same time significant inflation has occurred as well. Economics need to be considered in order to more accurately allocate Upper Cook Inlet salmon fisheries for maximum benefit for all the people of Alaska.

Provide consistent and predictable coho salmon escapements into the Northern District streams throughout the coho run timing between early July and mid September so as to maintain a viable sport fishery for a species whose highest economic value is reached through a targeted sport fishery.

Northern bound chum salmon have suffered a decline in abundance as evidenced in the catch record history for both the commercial fishery in upper Cook Inlet and also in the Susitna River tributary sport fisheries. The declining trend of chum salmon bound for the Susitna River was identified by the Board of Fisheries in XXXX, and that BOF created a specific pass through period restricting the Upper Cook Inlet Drift Fishery, and directed ADF&G to write a chum salmon

management plan. The Matanuska Valley AC requests a chum salmon management plan be created for Northern bound chum salmon including measured escapements of chum salmon to 3 or more streams. Escapement goals should be developed over time for chum salmon as well.

Proposal #55 by Upper Cook Inlet Drifts Association (UCIDA) for Kodiak Island commercial fishery requests restrictions on the Kodiak commercial fishery in order to obtain sockeye escapements and harvesting opportunities benefitting Upper Cook Inlet users. The Matanuska Valley AC requests this same concept, using classic salmon fishery management, as proposed by UCIDA be utilized in Upper Cook Inlet to pass Northern bound salmon through the Central District until at least the mid point of the Yentna River sockeye salmon goal range can be projected on or after July 23 on a yearly basis.

Proposals #74 & 75 would eliminate use of spotter aircraft in Upper Cook Inlet. supported 4-0 by Matanuska Valley AC fisheries subcommittee -- unless aircraft are used to increase numbers of Northern bound salmon reaching Northern District streams.

Fish Creek stocking — escapement goals adjusted downward by a previous BOF to reflect only wild sockeye — ADF&G continues counting all sockeye as escapement toward this adjusted goal — so in order to correctly count Fish Creek sockeye the Board should remove sockeye stocking program from Big Lake / Fish Creek.

Increased sport coho limits favored by the AC — if there are enough coho to remove commercial restrictions formerly found in the coho salmon conservation plan (done at the 2005 BOF meeting) then the limit restriction to the sport fishery provided by the same plan should have been removed as well. If there are not enough surplus coho to do this, and still obtain adequate coho escapements on a yearly basis, then out of fairness the BOF should reinstate the commercial restrictions. Especially considering Northern bound coho have been identified in a management plan to be managed primarily for the sport fishery / recreational purposes.

Mention should be made of flood conditions that will decrease future Northern bound salmon returns -- in particular chinook and coho -- some adjustment to future fishing opportunities seems necessary in order to reach desired future escapement levels.

Nov. 26, 2007 Fisheries Sub Committee

Proposal 111 -- unanimously opposed 0-4. moving fishery farther off the Eastside of Cook Inlet would likely increase the harvest of Northern Bound salmon which have failed to reach escapement objectives most years, while late run Kenai king salmon have been making escapements most years.

- 112 & 113 -- unanimously opposed 0-4 because of impacts of additional harvests this would create.
- 114 -- unanimous support 4-0 we support this as a housekeeping proposal that may simplify regulations.
- 115 -- unanimously opposed 0-4 Could reallocate a lot of salmon away from the public use.
- 116. unanimously supported 4-0. prioritizes salmon for public users and would increase the likelihood of reaching midpoint escapement levels for all species of salmon in Upper Cook Inlet.
- 117. Unanimously supported 4-0.
- 118. Supported 4-0. Current large sockeye escapements to the Kenai system have continued to produce large returns along with harvest opportunities for all user groups.

119. 4-0 Supported.

120. 4-0 Support. While commercial managers claim that chum are not harvested as much because of the higher price for sockeye salmon and the lower price for chum salmon, this has always been the case in Upper Cook Inlet if the same number of chum salmon were still available harvests should have remained relatively static. In addition, sport fish harvests on the East side tributaries of the Susitna River have also declined dramatically further showing there has in fact been a decline in Upper Cook Inlet chum salmon.

Steve Runvan arrives will be reflected in later votes.

121 & 122. 5-0 Support. This would provide some salmon harvest for inriver uses without robbing from the salmon escapement. An even better solution would be for the Board of Fisheries to direct the commercial manager to manage using the mid point of the Yentna goal as the target rather than attempting to barely make the lower end of the goal. Common sense is that if the Department attempts to meet the very bottom end of the goal then 50% of the time the escapement would be below the minimum and 50% of the time would be above. While we view a 50% success rate as unacceptable for meeting escapement objectives -- The Department has failed to meet even that level of success.

- 123. 5-0 Support.
- 124. No Action we have not seen any new language to comment on as of late November.
- 125. opposed 0-5 unanimously. This would take away harvest opportunities from the greatest number of users in Upper Cook Inlet and increase the likelihood of missing escapement goals other than the Kenai River sockeye goal.
- 126. opposed 0-5 unanimously. Emergency Orders over ruling management plans need to be justified.
- 127, 128, 129, 130, 131. Opposed 0-5 unanimously. We believe achieving at least the midpoint of all goals should have priority over exceeding upper end of escapement goals elsewhere in Upper Cook

Inlet,-- especially when current Upper Cook Inlet Goals are Sustainable Escapement Goals and not Biological Escapement Goals, and thus the upper end of productive escapements has yet to be established.

- 132 -- Support 5-0. We definitely prefer the Board of Fish and ADF&G achieve the midpoint of the Fish Creek sockeye and Yentna sockeye goals, however, we support achieving each minimum goal as a priority over not exceeding a maximum Sustainable Escapement Goal somewhere else.
- 133, 134, 135, 136, 137. Oppose 0-5 unanimously. These proposals would dramatically reduce harvest opportunities for sport and personal use fisheries much more than they would increase commercial harvest opportunities. The state's fisheries shall be managed for maximum benefit.
- 138. Support 5-0 Unanimously This management, while better for Northern Bound salmon must also be strengthened. We encourage the Board of Fisheries to view this plan as a way to come close to reaching the minimum Yentna sockeye goal on about half of the years, however we also encourage the Board to implement changes aimed at reaching the midpoint of the goal on a minimum of half of the years.

The Sustainable Salmon Fisheries Policy calls for spawning escapements scattered throughout the goal range — current management ignores this concept for Northern bound salmon stocks managed by the Yentna River sockeye salmon escapement range since current management practices result in less than minimum range escapement levels on most years.

Andy Couch left meeting.

139. Support 4-0; this will allow limited fishing on Alexander Creek, further restrictions might be added such as fishing restricted to within a ¼ mile of the mouth. Some of the fish caught here will be kings moving up river.

140. Support 4-0; this proposals clarifies obtaining the Yentna River sockeye salmon escapement goal shall have priority over staying within any upper Kenai River goal. An amendment should be made directing that the commercial fish manager shall manage to obtain an average mid-range of the Yentna goal through time. When the commercial manager fails to meet even the absolute lower end of the escapement range no harvestable surplus exists for sport or personal use opportunities. The only inriver fishing allowed under such low returns is subsistence fishing -and even subsistence harvests should not have to rob from needed spawning escapements. Without specific language to this or other management plans the Board of Fish would be supporting the current practice of allowing the commercial fish manager to continue ALLOCATING all of the Yentna River sockeye salmon harvestable surplus to the commercial fishery PLUS a portion of the Yentna River escapement goal. ADF&G records show this happens on most years in Upper Cook Inlet. Since the Yentna River sockeye salmon escapement goal is the only bench mark used by the ADF&G manager during the entire month of July the current management strategy likely at times also allocates most if not all the harvestable surplus and a portion of necessary escapements of all Northern bound sockeye, pink, chum, and coho salmon to the commercial fishery during July.

141 - 150 Oppose 0-4-0; these proposals ask for liberalizations in the Northern District set net fishery at times when coho and king salmon are at peak abundance levels. Such liberalizations would reduce harvest opportunities from the sport fishery to provide additional allocation to the commercial fishery. King salmon and coho salmon are the most important species to the sport fishery and provide maximum economic benefit when harvested by the sport fishery. Less than 100 commercial permits are fished in the Northern District, while thousands of sport fishermen fish Northern District stream drainages annually. If passed these proposals would clearly be penny wise and dollar foolish.

151, 152 Oppose 0-4-0; these proposals seek to open drift net commercial fishing in areas of Upper Cook Inlet at times when early run king salmon are at peak abundance levels. Opening such fisheries to drift gillnets would allocate an extremely valuable resource away from the sport fishery to a commercial fishery where there would not be enough resource available to make economic sense for the number of commercial drift netters that could participate. If these proposed fisheries are allowed to occur Northern District king salmon could be severely damaged. The Northern District king salmon fishery is set up with a maximum harvest cap of 12,000 king salmon, and not an allocation. It should be noted that the king salmon fishery proposed in 151 under the Northern District King Salmon Management plan would not even occur in the Northern District, and thus has no place in the plan. In addition, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game currently has management concerns for Northern king salmon stocks based on the effects of inriver floods during the late summer of 2006. Early indications are that king salmon production will be decreased for the next few years as a result.

153. No Action

154-158. Oppose; 0-4-0; these proposals seek to expand current

commercial pink salmon fisheries for a fish with low economic value. Such action would consequently expand commercial harvest of coho salmon at the expense of sport fisheries. Coho salmon are one of the most valuable salmon species to the sport fisheries.

- 159. Oppose 0-4-0; this would allow unlimited pink fishing and greatly increase the coho by-catch.
- ******160-162. Oppose 0-4-0;these proposals would greatly increase sockeye salmon harvest and greatly increase the harvest of all Northern District salmon.
- 163. Support 4-0-0; this eliminate the new drift areas established at the 2005 board meeting and puts the drift fleet back in the old three mile corridor. This should help increase needed escapements of salmon to Northern streams systems.
- *****164. Support 4-0-0; these is a house keeping proposal it clarifies what can be done from 1 Aug. when one plan end to 11 Aug when another plan starts.
- 165. Support 4-0-0; this would proposal would reinstate the sun setting previsions of the 2005 west side of Cook Inlet drift fishery during Aug.



- 160. 0-4-0 We oppose this proposal because current ADF&G forecasts and protections within the Central District Drift Gillnet Fishery Management Plan are inadequate to meet Northern District sockeye salmon spawning escapement goals as seen in Yentna River sonar sockeye salmon escapement counts. This proposal would remove some of the already inadequate protections within this management plan. Increased management flexibility controlled entirely by the commercial manager often results in missing or barely achieving the escapement goal and little or no surplus fish for harvest by Northern District or inriver users.
- 161-162. Oppose 0-4-0; We oppose the idea of removing specific language from management plans which was originally put into the plans to provide protections for Northern bound salmon stocks. Since ADF&G has failed to meet the Yentna River sockeye salmon escapement goals 2 out of the past 3 years and since ADF&G has only met the midpoint of the Yentna River sockeye salmon escapement goal once in the past 10 years, specific language to protect Yentna sockeye should be strengthened rather than removed.
- 164. Support 4-0-0 We support the concept of using specific management language in management plans throughout the entire season.
- 166. Oppose 0-4-0. We oppose the concept of management to stay under the top end of a spawning escapement goal range without consideration to the impacts on other salmon stocks, other salmon species, and other user groups. Maximizing the harvest of one user group should not come at the expense of salmon escapement needs and viable harvest opportunities for other user groups.
- 167, 168. Oppose 0-4-0. Maximizing commercial sockeye harvest at the expense of personal use fisheries, sport fisheries, and escapements of other salmon stocks is unacceptable.

The Mount Yenlo Advisory Committee wishes to convey to the Board of Fish that it believes that there has been, and may continue to be a major over-exploitation of the Northern District/Susitna drainage salmon stocks of all 5 types of salmon by Central District nets. There are many unknowns in this equation, but it is a fact that fish are being intercepted by the nets. We believe that there is a real concern for the future of our fish stocks in the Northern streams such as the Susitna and Yentna that thousands of our Alaskan residents have relied on for many years for our way of life, be it economic, consumptive, or as recreational family use.

We believe that this system can have larger returns, and not the smaller returns as has become normal lately.

Therefore, based on our members years of personal study and professional experience in the fisheries in this area, Mount Yenlo believes that liberalizing, or extending seasons, gear or areas for any commercial net fisheries at this time is unwise and additionally believes these commercial fisheries should be further restricted from exploiting these stocks to allow them to return to more abundant numbers.

Passage of any one of these proposals could place discreet stocks or runs in danger.

The Committee has reflected these concerns in our voting by failing any proposals that will liberalize net fisheries in salt water.

The Committee has also failed to support all proposals to liberalize in-river uses in the Susitna/Yentna system except No. 342, which would just return Coho bag limits to prior years.

It is the Board's duty to protect these stocks and their common uses, when that is possible. It is also the Board's duty to restore these stocks now.

The term "over-escapement" has never been applied in the Northern District rivers.

It is the time to try something different...if you follow no other rules or regulations or laws...follow the rule of <u>CONSERVATION</u>.
