

Villages Affected by Proposal 374

Nushagak River Villages 2012 Census DATA Koliganek – 337; New Stuyahok -531; Ekwok- 120; Dillingham-2413; Aleknagik-221; Clarks Point-64 total population of the drainage =3686 using the 30-70 rule for subsistence

Users are about 30% of the above populations =1105.8 users along the river

- First is bait restrictions of this proposal is a good way to protect the mortality issue for king salmon and when there is a conservation issue. Using bait for all other species that are not in any way threatened with being affected because they are targeted as food fish
- This proposal was to target sport caught fish during the King season (only if it has been a proven way to reduce fatality of sport caught fish)
- The majority of the drainage residents target fish other than Kings (pike, grayling, Coho, trout, food fish, ECT...).not only as sport but to feed themselves and their families.
- Choggiung reported 2013 MUD 5924 and the operators for 2014 are booked all ready. Because of the Kenai restrictions...
