NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

Brief Description

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Fish and Game proposes to change regulations by adopting by reference the 2018 versions of the logbook and vessel registration requirements for sport fishing guide services and sport fishing services operating in fresh and salt waters for the 2018 fishing season.

The commissioner of the Department of Fish and Game proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) related to reporting requirements for sport fishing services and sport fishing guides, including the following:

5 AAC 75.076(a) is proposed to be changed to adopt by reference the 2018 version of the Saltwater Charter Logbook and Vessel Registration for those owners of a business conducting sport fishing services and guides operating in salt waters and the 2018 version of the Freshwater Sport Fish Guide Logbook and Vessel Registration for the owners of a business conducting sport fishing services and guides operating in fresh waters.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to Frances H. Leach, Regulations Program Coordinator, Department of Fish and Game, P.O. Box 115526, Juneau, AK 99811-5526. Additionally, the Department of Fish and Game will accept comments by facsimile at (907) 465-2604 and by electronic mail at frances.leach@alaska.gov. The comments must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on December 22, 2017.

You may submit written questions relevant to the proposed action to Frances H. Leach, Regulations Program Coordinator, at Department of Fish and Game, P.O. Box 115526, Juneau, AK 99811-5526, or by electronic mail at frances.leach@alaska.gov. The questions must be received at least 10 days before the end of the public comment period. The Alaska Department of Fish and Game will aggregate its response to substantially similar questions and make the questions and responses available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and www.sf.adfg.alaska.gov.

The language of the final regulations may be different from that of the proposed regulations. You should comment during the time allowed if your interests could be affected.



rafts, canoes, kayaks, motorized and nonmotorized water vehicles.

2018 Freshwater Sport Fish Vessel Registration (Cont'd)

VESSEL REGISTRATION

The following applies to all powered and non-powered vessels being used to conduct sport fishing guided activities:

- Must be currently licensed with the Alaska Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and hold a current AK Registration number or hold a current U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) Vessel Documentation number.
- Must be registered with the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) and display an ADF&G vessel decal with the current year tag.
- Vessels borrowed or purchased in-season must adhere to the above criteria and display ADF&G sport fish guide vessel decals.

Upon registration, each vessel is issued two charter vessel decals and current year tabs.

See page iii for instructions on vessels that are added midseason.

VESSEL DECALS/YEAR TABS

One set of ADF&G decals will be issued per registered vessel. Decals must be displayed and visible on each side of the vessel. Decals do not have to be applied directly to the hull of the vessel. Decals can be adhered to wood, fiberglass or plexiglas® which in turn is secured to each side of the vessel. Decals can be transferred from one vessel to another, as long as the receiving vessel has a current AK registration number from DMV or a USCG documentation number and has been registered with ADF&G. Decals are designed to withstand several years of use. Annual tabs will be issued as vessels are registered. Annual year tabs are to be adhered directly to the decal in the designated area.

2018 Freshwater Sport Fish Logbook Regulations

RESPONSIBILITY OF BUSINESS OWNER & GUIDE

Guides are responsible for completing logbook pages in the manner and at the location specified in the logbook instructions.

ADF&G registered business owners are responsible for reporting logbook information and submitting the completed logbook pages to the department for fishing activities from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 for each sport fishing guide they employ in accordance with the schedule printed inside the front cover of the logbook.

2018 Freshwater Sport Fish

Logbook Regulations (Cont'd)

WHAT A GUIDE MUST HAVE IN POSSESSION WHILE GUIDING

While engaged in providing sport fish guide services, a sport fishing guide shall have the following readily available for inspection upon request of a representative of the Department or a peace officer of the state:

- a current ADF&G sport fishing guide registration;
- a copy of the current ADF&G sport fishing business owner's registration of the guide's employer;
- a current Alaska sport fishing license, tags, stamps or permits that are required to engage in the sport fishery for which guide services are being provided;
- an identification card issued to the sport fishing guide by a state or federal agency that bears a photo of the sport fishing guide (e.g. driver's license);

There may be additional requirements by other state and federal agencies (e.g. USCG). It is your responsibility to determine what those requirements are.

RETURN THE LOGBOOK PAGES WEEKLY

Fishing activity that occurs <u>prior</u> to April 2, 2018 is due to ADF&G by April 9, 2018; all activity thereafter must be received by ADF&G EVERY WEEK as detailed in the schedule on the inside of the front cover of this book.

For fishing activity that occurs in the early winter of 2018, please call the local ADF&G office for logbook instructions if the 2018 logbooks are not yet available.

All 2018 logbook data must be received by January 7, 2019.

PINK COPIES OF THE LOGBOOK PAGES ARE TO REMAIN IN THE LOGBOOK.

2018 Freshwater Sport Fish Logbook Instructions

WHEN TO COMPLETE A LOGBOOK

Logbook pages must be completed at the end of each day of fishing or at the end of each trip within a day as described below through the last trip of the season.

The guide that leads the trip is required to complete logbook pages per the instructions described below.

NO VESSEL USED

Aircraft, highway vehicles, walk-in, ATVs, etc.

Complete the logbook before the guide leaves the fishing site. Fishing site is defined as the location where the fishing activity took place. Refer to the list of unique freshwater site codes provided with the logbook.

2018 Freshwater Sport Fish

Logbook Instructions (Cont'd)

VESSEL USED

Returning to a lodge, camp, dock or mooring location:

Complete the logbook before offloading any fish from the vessel. If no fish were kept, complete the logbook before offloading any clients.

Returning to a boat ramp, launching site, or other client drop off location:

Complete the logbook before the vessel <u>or</u> guide departs the launching/landing site <u>AND</u> before offloading any fish from the vessel.

If <u>no fish</u> were kept, complete the logbook before the guide departs the launch/landing site.

MULTIPLE TRIPS PER DAY

Each trip of multiple trips in a day should be logged on a separate logbook page. Complete the logbook at the end of each trip, as described above.

MULTI-DAY TRIPS

Complete the logbook at day's end for each day of the trip. Use a separate logbook page for each day of the trip.

MULTIPLE SITES FISHED

If multiple sites were fished on the same day, each site will require a new logbook page labeled with the same date. Each page will need to be completed prior to leaving the site per the instructions above. This includes those river systems containing multiple and unique site code numbers.

LOGBOOK ASSIGNMENTS/TRANSFERS

Logbooks are issued to individual registered businesses. Due to the variety of ways that freshwater businesses conduct operations, the number of logbooks issued to a unique business will vary.

The business owner or their representative must determine how many logbooks that business will be required to have in order to comply with the recording requirements outlined in the instructions. For example, an operation that conducts business from a lodge with 6 guides may need more logbooks than a single business owner/guide with one vessel that is trailered.

A logbook is assigned by ADF&G to the business; the business owner can distribute individual logbooks to a vessel or to a guide. It is up to the discretion of the business owner to distribute logbooks to employed guides in any manner that facilitates the timely recording of trip information as described previously in the instructions.

ADF&G Sport Fish Guide Registration Number - The 2018 **guide** registration number issued by ADF&G to the guide. Only one guide registration number should appear on each logbook page.

Date Fished - The date for each trip taken. If multiple trips to multiple different fishing sites were taken on the same day, that date and unique trip information would appear on as many logbook pages as there were unique trips. Although the date would be the same, client information and trip specifics may differ. If there were more than six clients, continue on a separate logbook page with the trip information and individual angler license information carried over to the new page.

Hour Trip Ended - Record the hour the trip ended with the offloading of clients and/or fish. Round to the nearest hour only. Circle AM or PM. For multi-day trips record the hour the trip ended each day.

River/Stream/Lake (Specify) - The name of the site where fishing activity occurred.

Site Code - Refer to the site code list provided with the logbook for the site code associated with the river, stream or lake where fishing activity occurred. Write the site code down as it appears on this list. If no site code exists for your fishing site, use the code for Other Streams or Other Lakes.

Other Species Write-In - On the line denoted with an *, write in the name of the "other" species kept or released. Use the last blank column on the right to record the catch of this "other" species of fish as long as it does not already have an existing column. If more than one "other" species is kept or released, use an existing column, cross out the existing species of fish not present at this fishing site and write in the name of that second species.

Once a species has been written in, that column becomes dedicated to that species for the remainder of that logbook page.

Examples of Other Species: pink (or humpy) salmon, chum (or dog) salmon, burbot, and whitefish.

Residency - In the columns to the left of each sport fish license number, circle:

- R for Resident
- N for Nonresident.

How to Fill Out the Logbook (cont'd)

Sport Fish License Number - Record the current Alaska Sport Fishing License number, resident PID (permanent license number) or DAV (disabled AK veteran license number) of each client, comped angler, and crew that fished. A "comped" angler is an angler who is not paying for this charter; it can include family, friends or other acquaintances.

Record resident anglers under 18 years old and non-resident anglers under 16 years old as "Youth angler 1 (YA1), Youth angler 2 (YA2)" etc., uniquely identifying them as 1, 2 or 3 for as many as fished on each trip.

Record the license number of those clients that actively fished during any part of the trip regardless of whether they caught anything. Use one line per angler, recording the license number and all activity on that line.

Crew Status should be noted to the right of each angler sport fish license number, if applicable, circle:

• <u>C</u> if angler is the guide or a Crew member

RECORDING SALMON AND OTHER SPECIES

Fish Kept & Released - Record the total number of fish kept (K) in the white row and released (R) in the gray row by each angler during that trip. Each angler's license number has a dedicated line assigned on each logbook page. If the same angler goes on more than one trip on the same day, that angler's license number will appear on as many logbook pages as were used.

PROXY FISHING INSTRUCTIONS

If a paying client is also proxy fishing for a beneficiary, that client must have the fishing license of the person for whom he/she is fishing. Write down the license number of the recipient of the fish (beneficiary), followed by a (P) to indicate proxy, e.g. 8123456-P.

Use two lines on the logbook data sheet, one for the angler's license number and one for the beneficiary's license number. Indicate (R) for Resident in the adjacent column; beneficiaries and those fishing for them <u>must</u> be residents of Alaska.

For permanent licenses (residents only), write down the entire license number, including the preceding alpha character, which can be a P, D, T or Z, i.e. Z50148-P.

Vessel Registration

All vessels used in sport fishing guide activities must be registered with ADF&G. All vessels must have a current AK registration number issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or a current USCG documentation number prior to registering with ADF&G. If the vessel has an AK number, the AK number must be displayed during guided fishing operations.

Vessel Decal/Year Tags

One set of ADF&G decals will be issued per registered vessel. Decals must be applied and visible on both sides of the vessel. Decals do not have to be applied directly to the hull of the vessel. Decals can be adhered to wood, fiberglass or plexiglas[®] which in turn is secured to both sides of the vessel. Decals can be transferred from one vessel to another; as long as the receiving vessel has a current AK registration number from DMV or a current USCG documentation number and has been registered with ADF&G. Annual stickers or tags will be issued as vessels are registered and must be adhered directly to the decal in the designated area. Lost decals and tags can be replaced free of charge at any ADF&G office.

Transferring A Logbook

A logbook is issued to a specific business for a specific vessel. All active vessels must be registered and issued a current year logbook from an ADF&G office. Logbooks may not be transferred between businesses. Only the business the logbook is issued to may use the logbook.

If a vessel belonging to a registered sport fish business is borrowed by another business, the borrowing business must be currently registered and must acquire their own logbook.

If a business substitutes a different vessel for the primary vessel during any part of the season, the original logbook can be used on the substitute vessel for up to seven (7) consecutive days. A temporary vessel used for more than seven (7) consecutive days must be issued a new logbook. ADF&G must be notified (see contact information on page v) with the substitute vessel registration information.

All vessels engaged in fishing with clients on board must be registered and display the vessel decals.

Return The Logbook Pages Weekly

Fishing activity that occurs <u>prior</u> to April 2, 2018 is due to ADF&G by April 9, 2018; all activity thereafter must be received by ADF&G EVERY WEEK as detailed in the schedule on the inside of the front cover of this book. Logbook pages can be submitted to any ADF&G office or mailed to the address printed on the back of each logbook page.

PINK COPIES OF THE LOGBOOK PAGES ARE TO REMAIN IN THE LOGBOOK

Responsibility Of Business Owner & Guide

Guides are responsible for completing logbook pages in the manner and at the location specified in the logbook instructions.

ADF&G licensed business owners are responsible for reporting logbook information and submitting the completed logbook pages to the department for fishing activities from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 for each sport fishing guide they employ in accordance with the schedule printed inside the front cover of the logbook.

What A Guide Must Have In Possession While Guiding

While providing sport fishing guide services, a sport fishing guide shall have the following readily available for inspection by request of a representative of the Department of Fish & Game, a peace officer of the state, or law enforcement representative of the National Marine Fisheries Service:

- a current sport fishing guide license issued by ADF&G;
- copy of the current ADF&G sport fishing owner's business license of the guide's employer;
- > a current Alaska sport fishing license, tags, stamps or permits that are required to engage in the sport fishery for which guide services are being provided;
- ➤ an identification card issued to the sport fishing guide by a state or federal agency that bears a photo of the sport fishing guide. The identification card MUST match the name on the guide license;
- per federal regulation a Saltwater Charter Logbook if halibut are being harvested;

Other agencies such as the USCG or National Marine Fisheries Service may have additional requirements. It is your responsibility to determine what those requirements are.

See page v for Federal Regulations.

When To Complete A Logbook Page

A Charter Vessel Fishing Trip is defined as the time period between the first deployment of fishing gear from a vessel providing sport fishing guide services and the offloading of one or more anglers or any harvested fish from the vessel.

A trip that consists of no paying clients, that is, all anglers are "comped", and the guide is NOT receiving any tips or other compensation, would NOT be considered a chartered trip and a logbook page should not be completed and submitted to the Alaska Dept. of Fish and Game. If a guide is present during a private fishing trip, the guide may be compensated for actual daily expenses for fuel, food, or bait. In this case a logbook page should not be completed or submitted to ADF&G. If the guide receives any other compensation for assisting anglers, such as daily wages, tips, moorage fees, etc. from a registered fishing service or from clients, then a logbook page should be completed and submitted to ADF&G.

Before a Trip Begins (see definition above), the Guide must Record:

- ➤ The 2018 sport fishing license number, permanent identification number (PID) or disabled veteran (DAV) license number for anyone that will fish during any part of the trip, including paying and non-paying (comped) anglers and crew.
- ➤ The first and last name of each angler in the space provided below their license number.
- ➤ The word "Youth" in the fishing license space along with the first and last name on the name line for resident anglers under 18 years old and non-resident anglers under 16 years old. Multiple youth anglers on a trip should be recorded as Youth 1, Youth 2 etc.

Complete the logbook through the last charter trip of the season in the following manner:

Returning to a Dock:

Complete and sign the logbook page before offloading any fish from the vessel. If no fish were kept, complete and sign the logbook page before offloading any clients.

No Docking Facilities (e.g. trailered vessels):

- ➤ Complete and sign the logbook page before the vessel <u>or</u> guide departs the launch/landing site AND before offloading any fish from the vessel.
- ➤ If <u>no fish</u> were kept, complete and sign the logbook page before the vessel <u>or</u> guide departs the launch/landing site.

No Vessel Used (aircraft, highway vehicles, walk-in, ATVs, etc.):

➤ Complete and sign the logbook page before the guide leaves the fishing site. Fishing site is defined as the location where fishing activity took place.

Multiple Trips per Day:

Use a separate logbook page for each trip if multiple trips where taken during the same day. Complete and sign the logbook page at the end of each trip as described above.

Multi-Day Trips:

Complete and sign a logbook page at the end of each day on which sport fishing guide services were provided. Use a separate logbook page for each day of the trip. Record the port or community of offloading at the end of the multiple-day trip, not the port or location where the vessel anchored or moored each night.




HOW TO REPORT INFORMATION ON THE LOGBOOK PAGE

The 2018 logbook pages are designed to be read by an optical scanner. Your cooperation and neatness in reporting minimizes data entry time and cost, and makes the information available sooner.

- 1. Use clear and legible handwriting. Print: do not use cursive.
- 2. Use a black ink pen; do not use a pencil or other color pen.
- 3. Do not write in the margins.
- 4. Do <u>not</u> write 0's (zero) if a client did not keep or release any fish during a trip, leave the kept and released fields blank.



5. Enter the trip information within the boxes and lines provided. Stay within the "bracketed" space allowed:



6. Please keep the pages and logbook as clean as possible.

FEDERAL REGULATIONS

Federal regulations for IPHC Area 2C and 3A (1) authorize guided angler fish (GAF) for the Charter halibut fisheries, (2) prohibit the licensed guide and crew members from retaining halibut on any charter vessel fishing trip, (3) require all anglers in IPHC Areas 2C and 3A who harvest (keep) halibut to sign the logbook, and (4) require a saltwater charter logbook be on the vessel if halibut are being harvested.

NOAA CONTACT INFORMATION:

There are numerous differences between State and Federal regulations that govern charter fishing in 2C and 3A, which all operators must be aware of, and operate under. For additional information on federal charter logbook requirements for halibut, call NOAA Fisheries Office for Law Enforcement (907) 586-7225.
