Conservation is everyone job. All gear groups and all sectors need to work to ensure sustainable king salmon runs for southeast Alaska. Some years this is going to require sacrifice from everyone to make it work. This management plan needs to be equitable for all gear groups and all sectors to meet escapement goals. I think the board has done this for the commercial fleet but more work need to be done for the sport sector on the outer coast and district 14.

- I would like the board to consider closing the coastal high abundance areas to sport fishing during spring. This would still allow sport fishing but reduce the impacts to king salmon. This is a proven, useful management tool to reduce impacts to king salmon. The boundaries already exist and could be quickly and easily implemented by ADF&G.
- I would like the board to consider a reduction to bag and possession limits tied to this action plan.
- Area 14/district 114 (Homeshore/Cross Sound area) should be closed through June 14th to allow Chilkat king salmon to migrate through—this is similar to the sport closures in districts 11 and 12.
