## Eastern Interior Alaska Subsistence Regional Advisory Council Resolution

On Overproduction and Operation of Private Non-profit Hatcheries

**WHEREAS,** in January 2001 at the Alaska Board of Fisheries meeting the hatcheries promised to reduce hatchery production volume at that time by 25%;

WHEREAS, high production of private, non-profit hatcheries causes more straying of hatchery-produced salmon into wild salmon systems and into other regions of the state, competes with wild salmon in the marine environment, and results in serious, long-term negative impacts to the Yukon River and upper Copper River salmon stocks that are utilized in subsistence fisheries;

**WHEREAS**, the high production of private, non-profit hatcheries is in violation of the hatchery protocol between the Alaska Board of Fisheries, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, and the Alaska Sustainable Salmon Policy;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that Eastern Interior Alaska Subsistence Regional Advisory Council asks that the Alaska Board of Fisheries comply with hatchery protocol dated 29 June 2002 and reform the Hatchery Committee as a standing committee for the purpose of monitoring from a state-wide perspective hatchery production and operations.
