

This RC is submitted in support of Proposal 61 and demonstrates where the tagging study conducted in 1968 that showed that over 90% of the sockeye harvested in the Igvak section was bound for Chignik. Despite comments diminishing the size of the area subject to the tagging study, these maps also demonstrate that tagging occurred all the way up towards the Eastern boundary of the Igvak section.

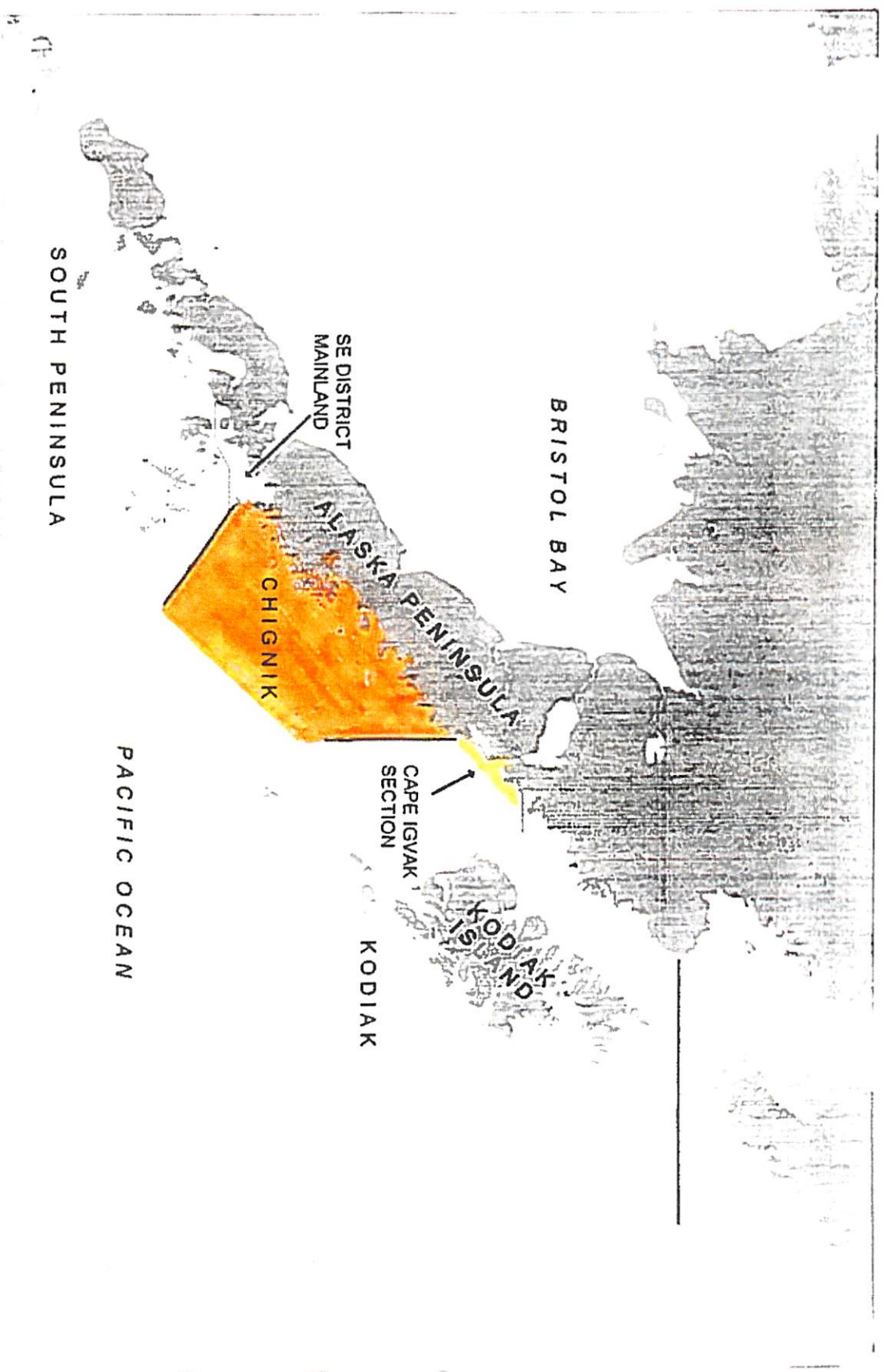


Figure 5. Map showing the location of the Chignik area relative to the Cape Igvak Section and other western Alaska areas.

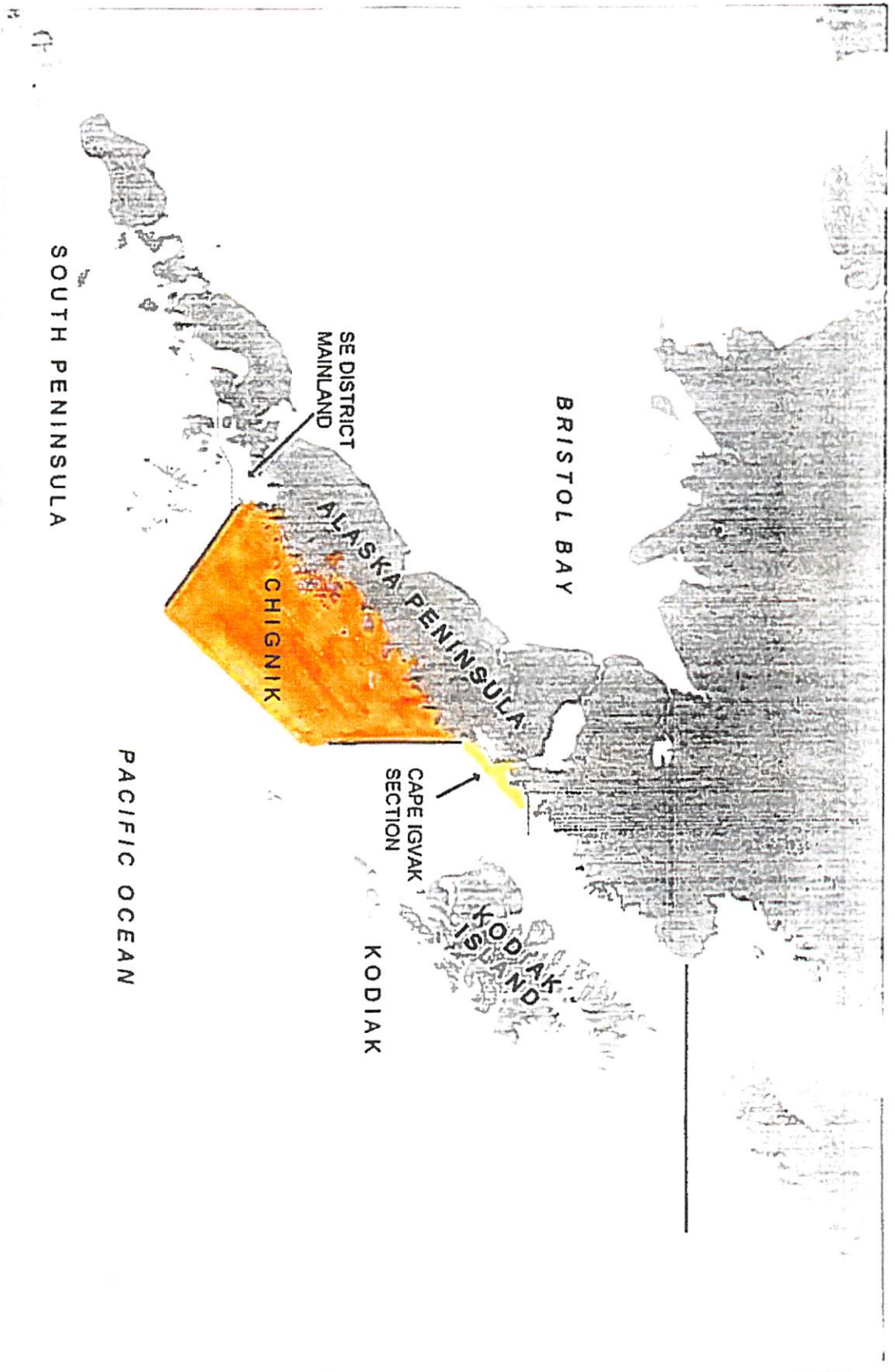


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
