

# CURRENT KSMP (5AAC 47.055) COMPARED TO PROPOSAL RC 139

- Allocation change from 20% to 25% to the sport fishery in lower abundance tiers (f,g, and h).
- Any underage in the various fisheries will transfer to the Troll fishery.
- Payback provision: An overage in the all-gear catch limit will come off the top of the next year's all-gear catch limit.
- Department will utilize inseason management in the sport fishery not to exceed the allocation.
- Department will not increase opportunity to achieve allocation in the sport fishery.
- Resident fishery will not close.

# CURRENT KSMP (5AAC 47.055) COMPARED TO PROPOSAL 82

- Added provisions in Tier (f) and (g) in the event that wild stock conservation measures are no longer required.
- Regulatory language for a resident priority and an increased limit for residents within those areas closed to retention to protect Alaska wildstocks have been consolidated but not changed.
- Direction to manage the sport fishery to an inseason allocation remains inconsistent.

# CURRENT KSMP (5AAC 47.055) COMPARED TO PROPOSAL 83

- Manage the Sport fishery for an average across time.
- Nonresident bag/annual limits reduced in upper tiers (c) and (d).
- Resident bag limit increased from 1 to 2 in tier (f).
- Nonresident opportunity increased through time and harvest limits increases in tiers (f) (g) and (h).
- Removes resident preference for inseason management (no inseason management).
- Omits the use of 2 rods in winter.
