Amended Language to Proposal 256 (formerly ACR 9)

In the Togiak River Drainage

(1) Only unbaited, single hook, artificial lures or flies may be used to target King Salmon. The use of fish eggs in any form is prohibited for any species of salmon, trout or char.

- (2) Bait use The use of fish eggs in any form, as bait is prohibited for all species. Non–fish egg bait may be used to wrap or tip artificial lures, or flies when targeting any species besides King Salmon.
- (3) King salmon limits 20 inches or longer: no retention allowed. Any king salmon 20 inches or longer must not be removed from the water and must be released immediately. Less than 20 inches: 10 per day, 10 in possession
- (4) Upstream of the confluence of Gechiak Creek and the Togiak River: Closed year-round to fishing for king salmon.

Definition of fish eggs is as follows:

Any natural fish egg or eggs, originating from the gut cavity of a female fish of any species, whether in single form, or adhered together by the skein or any natural or synthetic material, cured or uncured, dyed or natural in color.
