Dear Members of the Board of Fisheries,


Please find attached a graph showing three different sets of data from the years 1975 - 2023:

- 1. Pink salmon eggs collected at Alaska hatcheries by PNP hatcheries under a PNP hatchery permit;
- 2. Pink salmon eggs collected at state and federal hatcheries;
- 3. PNP hatchery permitted capacity.

Following Mr. Mead Treadwell's testimony today, Ms. Carlson-Van Dort asked Mr. Treadwell if Alaska's PNP hatcheries should be more conservative in their egg take and/or production. Mr. Treadwell responded that according to his knowledge and most recent review of the egg take and/or production data, he did not find nor hold any issue with the PNP's numbers or production output.
