5 AAC 03.310. FISHING SEASONS.

(a) Except as provided in secs. 320 370 of this chapter salmon may be taken as follows:

(1) in the Yukon district

- (A) in subdistricts 1, 2 and 3 from June 10 through August 31 except that when June 10 falls within a closed weekly period the season will open the next fallowing open weekly period; the early season is closed by emergency order and subsequent seasons ore opened and closed by emergency orders;
- (B) in subdistricts 4, 5 and 6 from June 15 through September 30
- (i) the early season is closed by emergency order and subsequent seasons ore opened and closed by emergency order.

(c) Yukon district

(1) subdistrict l:

(B) after July 25, salmon may be token from 6:00 p.m. Monday thru 6:00 a.m. Wednesday and from 6:00 p.m. Thursday until 6:00 a.m. Saturday; (4) subdistrict 4;

(A) in section 4-A from June 15 through August 1, salmon may be taken from 6:00 p.m. Sunday until 6:00 p.m. Tuesday and from 6:00 pm. Wednesday until 6:00p.m. Friday;

(B) in section 4-B from June 15 through August 15, salmon may be token from 6:00 p.m. Sunday until 6:00 p.m. Friday;

(C) in section 4-B after August 15, salmon may be token from 6:00 p.m. Sunday until 6:00 p.m. Tuesday and from 6:00 p.m. Wednesday until 6:00 p.m. Friday;

(5) subdistrict 5:

- (A) in section 5-A from June 15 through August 15, salmon may be taken from 6:00 p.m. Tuesday until 6:00 p.m. Sunday;
- (B) in section 5-A after August 15, salmon may be taken from 6:00 p.m. Tuesday until 6:00 p.m. Thursday and from 6:00 p.m. Friday until 6:00 p.m. Sunday;

(C) in section 5-B salmon may be token seven days a week;
(6) subdistrict 6:

(A) June 15 through August 15. salmon may be token from 6:00 p.m. Wednesday until 6:00 p.m. Monday

(B) after August 15, salmon may be taken from 6:00 p.m. Monday until 6:00 p.m. Wednesday and from 6:00 p.m. Thursday until 6:00 p.m. Saturday

5 AAC 03.330. GEAR

(b) In the Yukon district

(1) in subdistricts 1, 2 and 3 set gillnets and drift gill nets may be operated;

(2) in subdistricts 4, 5 and 6 set gillnets and fishwheels may be operated;

(3) an individual may have in operation not more than one fishwheel at any one time,

5AAC 03.331 GILL NET SPECIFICATIONS AND OPERATION.

(b) In the Yukon district

- (1) the aggregate length of set gill net operated by on 1 individual may not exceed 150 fathoms and the length of o drift gill net operated by one individual may not exceed 50 fathoms;

(a) When the king salmon guideline harvest level has been attained the season in the district will be closed and a later season may be announced to attain guideline harvest levels for the other species of salmon.

(1) district 1 after July 15, district 2 after July 18, and district 3 after July 21: 120,000 to 220,000 chum salmon from the areas:

(1) in Districts 1, 2, and 3; the commissioner shall open the season by emergency order and close the season on or before September 1 at 12:01 a.m. by emergency order;

(2) in District 4: except as specified in 5 AAC 05.369, in Subdistricts 4-A, 4-B, and 4-C, the commissioner shall open the season by emergency order and close the season on or before October 1 at 12:01 a.m. by emergency order;

(3) in District 5, in all subdistricts, the commissioner shall open the season by emergency order and close the season on or before October 1 at 12:01 a.m. by emergency order;

YUKON AREA SUBSISTENCE FINFISH FISHERY

5 AAC 01.220. Lawful gear and gear specifications

(a) Salmon may be taken only by set and drift gillnet, dip net, beach seine, a hook and line attached to a rod or pole, handline, or fish wheel, subject to the restrictions set out in this section, 5 AAC 01.210, and 5 AAC 01.225 - 5 AAC 01.249.

(b) In District 4, salmon may be taken by drift gillnets that are not more than 25 fathoms in length, unless closed by emergency order.

(c) In Districts 5 and 6, salmon may not be taken for subsistence purposes by drift gillnets.

(d) Unless otherwise specified in this section, fish other than salmon and halibut may be taken only by gillnet, dip net, beach seine, a hook and line attached to a rod or pole, handline, fish wheel, fyke net, jigging gear, spear, longline, lead, or eel stick.

(e) The following apply to subsistence fishing:

(1) a gillnet may not exceed seven and one-half inch mesh size;

(2) the aggregate length of set gillnets in use by an individual may not exceed 150 fathoms;

(3) each drift gillnet in use by an individual may not exceed 50 fathoms in length;

YUKON AREA COMMERCIAL FINFISH FISHERY

5 AAC 05.310. Fishing seasons Except as provided in 5 AAC 05.320 - 5 AAC 05.380,

salmon may be taken only as follows:

(1) in Districts 1, 2, and 3, the commissioner shall open and close the season by emergency order;

(2) in District 4, the commissioner shall open and close the season by emergency order;

(3) in District 5, in all subdistricts, the commissioner shall open and close the season by emergency order;

(4) in District 6, the commissioner shall open the season by emergency order and close the season by emergency order.

5 AAC 05.320. Fishing periods

In the Yukon Area, in all districts and subdistricts, salmon may be taken only during fishing periods established by emergency order.

5 AAC 05.331. Gillnet specifications and operations

(a) Set gillnet gear may not exceed 150 fathoms in aggregate length.

(b) Drift gillnet gear may not exceed 50 fathoms in length.

(c) Salmon may be taken only with gillnets of six-inch or smaller mesh during periods established by emergency order.

(d) No gillnet gear may be operated in a manner to obstruct more than one-half the width of any waterway. In the intertidal zone, this restriction applies at all stages of the tide.

(e) In Districts 1 - 3, gillnets with

(1) greater than six-inch mesh may not be more than 45 meshes in depth;

(2) six-inch or smaller mesh may not be more than 50 meshes in depth.

(f) In Districts 4 - 6, gillnets with

(1) greater than six-inch mesh may not be more than 60 meshes in depth;

(2) six-inch or smaller mesh may not be more than 70 meshes in depth. (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, during times when the commissioner determines it to be necessary for the conservation of a salmon species, the commissioner may, by emergency order, close the fishing season in Districts 1 - 6 and immediately reopen the season during which a person may take salmon with a gillnet that has a mesh size of seven and one-half inches.

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, in Districts 1 - 3, during times when the commissioner determines that it is necessary for the conservation of king salmon, the commissioner may, by emergency order, close the fishing season and immediately reopen the season during which a person may take salmon only with a gillnet that has a mesh size of five and one-half inches or less, and that is not more than 30 meshes in depth.

(i) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, and 5 AAC 01.249 and 5 AAC 05.359 - 5 AAC 05.369, during times when the commissioner determines that it is necessary for the conservation of a salmon species, the commissioner may, by emergency order, close the fishing season and immediately reopen the season specifying the area in which one or more of the following gear limitations may be implemented:

(1) for fish wheels, as described in 5 AAC 05.333, the operator must closely attend the fish wheel while it is in operation, and all salmon must be immediately released to the water alive and must bypass any livebox unless retention is allowed by emergency order;

(2) dip nets may be used as described in 5AAC 05.362(k)(1)(A); all salmon caught with a dip net must be released to the water alive unless retention is allowed by emergency order;

(3) a beach seine may be used as described in 5AAC 05.362(k)(1)(B); all salmon caught with a beach seine must be released to the water alive unless retention is allowed by emergency order
