

**Recent proposals, by year. Proposal number, Action, and Description submitted to the Alaska Board of Fisheries that sought to reduce the maximum mesh size of gillnets in the Yukon Area, 2004-2023**

**2004**

PROPOSAL NO. 171 ACTION: Failed; DESCRIPTION: Decrease mesh size in districts Y1 and Y2.

**2007**

PROPOSAL NO. 163 ACTION: Failed; DESCRIPTION: Prohibit subsistence and commercial gillnets over 6-inch mesh size

PROPOSAL NO. 164 ACTION: No Action; DESCRIPTION: Prohibit commercial gillnets over 6 inch mesh size

PROPOSAL NO. 165 ACTION: Failed; DESCRIPTION: Restrict subsistence and commercial nets over 6 in mesh to 35 meshes deep

PROPOSAL NO. 166 ACTION: No Action; DESCRIPTION Restrict commercial nets over 6 inch mesh to 35 meshes in depth

PROPOSAL NO. 167 ACTION: No Action; DESCRIPTION: Modify commercial fishery to address changing size of king salmon.

**2010**

PROPOSAL NO. 90 ACTION: Carried as AMENDED; DESCRIPTION: Prohibit subsistence and commercial gillnets over 6-inch mesh size on the Yukon River. (Established a maximum mesh size of 7 ½ inches effective starting with the 2011 season.)

**2013**

PROPOSAL NO. 134 ACTION: Failed; DESCRIPTION: Require 6-inch or smaller mesh gillnets, with a maximum depth of 30 meshes, during June to July in District 1 if king salmon are a stock of concern and revert back if king salmon are no longer a stock of concern.

**2019**

PROPOSAL NO. 92 ACTION: Failed; DESCRIPTION: Restrict gillnet mesh size to a maximum of 6 inches in Districts 4, 5, and 6 subsistence and commercial salmon fisheries.
