



History


- Wolf control program in Unit 16B was implemented during RY2004.
- Wolf control program was reauthorized in May 2006 to include part of Unit 16A.
- Predator control program was modified to include black bear predation control in RY2008.
- Predator control program was reauthorized for 6 years and modified to include brown bear predation control in March 2011. The modifications were implemented during RY2011.
- Area available for wolf control was reduced in 2013, and the program was suspended in 2014.
- The predator control program was reauthorized for 6 years and included an Operational Plan for Intensive Management of Moose in February 2015.
- The bear control programs were suspended in 2017.
- The Intensive Management Plan for Unit 16 expired 1 July 2021

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

Unit 16B Moose Population, RY1990 – 2020









Unit 16B Twinning Rate, RY2004 - 2021







Unit 16B calf survival to fall, RY2004 – 2021




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

Wolf harvest by GMU, RY2000 – 2020





Brown Bear Harvest, Season Dates and Percent Females, RY2006 – 2020





Brown bear harvest by GMU, RY2006 – 2020





Decision framework to implement or suspend a treatment

- When mid-point of IM objective for moose pop. is achieved
- When wolf pop. surveys or info. indicate the need to avoid reducing numbers below the midpoint of 35 – 55 wolves
- When black bear pop. info. indicates the need to avoid reducing below 700 black bears
- When brown bear pop. Info. Indicates the need to avoid reducing below 375 brown bears
- If after 3 years the harvest of predators is not sufficient to make progress toward IM objectives for wolves, black bears, or brown bears; the program may be suspended for one or more predator

Predation control activities will be suspended or modified:

- When mid-point of IM objective for moose pop. is achieved, and harvest can be maintained within IM harvest objectives
- If after 3 years, there is no indication of an increase in the total number of moose
- When wolf reduction and pop. objectives have been met or after 3 years if no progress made toward objective
- When bear reduction and pop. objectives have been met or after 3 years if no progress made toward objective
- When declining twinning trends in twinning rate or other index of nutritional status are observed and indicate that objectives may be too high

Summary

- Conforms to current IM protocol
- Alters recently expired IM program by removing the use of helicopters by the public and foot snares for capturing bears
- Coincides with new Intensive Management Operational Plan for Unit 16B
- Moose population ~ 8,485; Pop. Objective 6,500 – 7,500
- Moose harvest objective is 310 – 600; achieved since RY15
- Wolf population 106 – 111 (67 – 68 in Unit 16B; IM objective is 35 – 55 in 16B
- Bear populations likely unaffected by previous control measures



Unit 14A Population Estimate





Unit 14B Population Estimate





Unit 14A Population Estimate





Unit 14B Population Estimate





Unit 14A Moose Harvest, RY2011 – 2020













Results of 2016 Unit 14A Browse Survey and Twinning Rate







Unit 14A Moose Harvest, RY2011 – 2020





Unit 14A Bull:100 Cow Ratios, RY2000 – 2020









Definitions are as follows:

Muzzle-loader: muzzle-loading rifles must be .54 caliber or larger, or at least .45 caliber with a 300 grain or larger elongated slug;

Black Powder cartridge rifles: must fire a 400-grain bullet or larger loaded with a minimum of 70 grains of black powder or equivalent (.45-70 with a 400-grain bullet or a .44-90 with a 550-grain bullet).



Summary

- Archery only seasons were adopted in 14B and 16A in RY95 and in 14A in RY98.
- 12% of moose harvested in 14A are taken by bow and arrow, 4% in 14B and 2% in 16A
- On average 75% of archery moose are taken during the archery only season.
- This is not expected to have a large impact
- Example; 14A, avg. 459 bulls * 9% = 41 / 8-day season = 5/day or 10 additional bulls under this proposal



Unit 16A Moose Population, RY2000 – 2020





Unit 16A Bull: 100 Cow ratios, RY1990 – 2020







Unit 16B Moose Population, RY2010 – 2020





Unit 16B Moose Population, RY1990 – 2020







Unit 16B Moose Harvest, RY2011 – 2020





Unit 16B Radio collared cow twinning rate, 2004 – 2021



Unit 16B calf survival to fall, 2004– 2021





14A Chugach Sheep Population













Brown Bear Harvest, Season Dates and Percent Females, RY2006 – 2020









Brown Bear Harvest, Season Dates and Percent Females, RY2006 – 2020





In units 7,9,11-13, 14A, 14B, 15-21, 23-25, 26B and 26C Black bears may be taken at permitted bait stations the same days you have flown, provided you are at least 300 feet from the airplane. (also applies to brown bears at bait stations in 14A, 14B, 16 and others.)

Same day airborne take is not allowed on National Park Service lands.


