

- Allowed unlimited nonresident sheep hunting opportunity
- Required all nonresidents to hire a guide
- Placed no limits on guides
- A guided sheep hunt costs upwards of \$25,000

PROPOSAL 36 - Change all nonresident general sheep hunts to drawing permit hunts

2020 Region III Meeting

PROPOSAL 52 – Change the nonresident general season sheep hunts in Units 20 Remainder and 19C to drawing permit, with a limited allocation of up to 50 permits for each hunt.

2021 ACR Meeting


ACR #4 – All current nonresident sheep hunting in Unit 19C to go to draw only, with a limited allocation of not more than 30 permits.

2022 ACR Meeting

ACR #12 – Limit nonresident sheep hunting in Unit 19C to drawing permit only, with up to 20 permits available.

2023 Board-generated PROPOSAL 204 – Close resident and nonresident hunting for Dall sheep in Unit 19C, for five years

Fewer guides = fewer nonresident clients = fewer dollars to the Department


