

RESOLUTION OF THE ALASKA BOARD OF GAME

WHEREAS, the Alaska Board of Game has recieved a draft Kilbuck Caribou Herd Management Plan, developed by ADF&G, U.S.F.W.S. and representatives of several villages in Unit 18 and Unit 17(A), and has also received a proposal by the Association of Village Council Presidents for "limited subsistence hunting by residents who have customarily and traditionally hunted this herd," and


WHEREAS, the Alaska Board of Game is not currently authorized to provide for limited subsistence hunting except by employing the provisions of 5 AAC 92.062 (Priority for Subsistence Hunting; Tier II Permits), and 5AAC 92.063 (Tier II Subsistence Hunting Permit Point System), and

WHEREAS, Alaska Statutes and Tier II subsistence hunting regulations only allow the Alaska Board of Game to allocate game for a subsistence hunt, and do not allow the Board to allocate permits,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the Alaska Board of Game approves and endorses the efforts of the parties to the development of the draft Kilbuck Caribou Herd Management Plan;
2. That the Alaska Board of Game adopts and endorses the Goals and Management Objectives as stated in the draft Kilbuck Caribou Herd Management Plan; and
3. That the Alaska Board of Game requests that the parties to the development of the draft Plan continue their work to complete the Plan and submit a final draft for review and adoption by the Board; and
4. That the Alaska Board of Game will take whatever steps are permissible by law to implement the Goals and Management Objectives of the Plan by providing for limited subsistence hunts through the Tier II subsistence hunting permit regulations.
