#### <u>Advisory Committee Regulations Up for Consideration</u>

A meeting of the Joint Board of Fisheries and Game has been set for March 25-29, 2024, in Anchorage to address regulations for the advisory committees, board processes, and subsistence uses. This type of meeting occurs once every five years, so now is the time to request adjustments to regulations for the advisory committee program including membership, function, and uniform rules of operation. Your regional coordinators know these regulations inside and out, so contact them directly if you have ideas for changes that may help improve the AC process. The proposal deadline is May 1, 2023. The regulations on the Joint Board Call for Proposals fall under 5 AAC Chapters 96, 97 and 99.
