Yeah I can see what you mean in some of the keys but at that size, we don't always see the black or white fin edges showing up.

However, I think this Twentymile River nomination provides a good baseline for comparing Chinook and sockeye juveniles side by side with some of the better traits coming through such as colors (the juvenile Chinook has black pigmentation on the dorsal, some orange/red in fins and face). And those sockeye look more like the Slana sockeye, though I do still think the Copper River chinook don't have such obvious colors at the sizes they are in the glacial rivers...

So yeah, we can change that back to sockeye and commit to that ID if you all agree.

I see what you are saying about some possible melanofores around the edge of the adipose in one Nom picture and your example, but it's quite faint for what I would expect on a Chinook. Not enough to really make that call imo. Then the other keys don't seem very strong for Chinook.

I see irregular/staggered parr mark spacing, aligned more above lateral line.

Parr mark height smaller than eye diameter.

Dorsal fins lack black leading edge/white tip. Anal fins lack white leading edge (most examples at least).

I agree it's a tricky looking one. I called it Chinook because the parr marks were relatively large/oblong for the size of the fish while being uniform in their position relative to each other and the lateral line. I called em sockeye initially but changed the ID upon looking at the images longer and convincing myself otherwise. So maybe should have stuck with the field/first ID.

What specifically stands out as sockeye?

I attached an image of what looks to me more like a sockeye at that size and say that compared to the fish in question, this individual has narrower parr marks that are not as uniformly distributed along the lateral line. But at this size, it's hard to tell and I might be overthinking it and should get overruled to turn it sockeye again. Probably would've been best to take a voucher or three for genetics to confirm! But we can see what Duncan says because I think we discussed this one too...I also attached an image of what I would more confidently call a similarly-sized juvenile Chinook (really uniformly distributed and oblong parr marks plus the coloration in the anal and caudal fins lead me to that ID).

Let me know what you all think. The ~35mm or less fish are tricky.


Hey there, question about the fish ID on this one. Adam caught it but upon further


review I'd have to agree. This seems way more sockeye looking than Chinook. Thoughts? Any field notes for this site?
