In the northeast corner of James Lagoon there is a stream that comes off the side of the hill, with a barrier falls (approximately 50 ft.), a couple of hundred feet from the lagoon. We counted 42 pink salmon in the clear stream water, with more in the immediate area of glacial water.

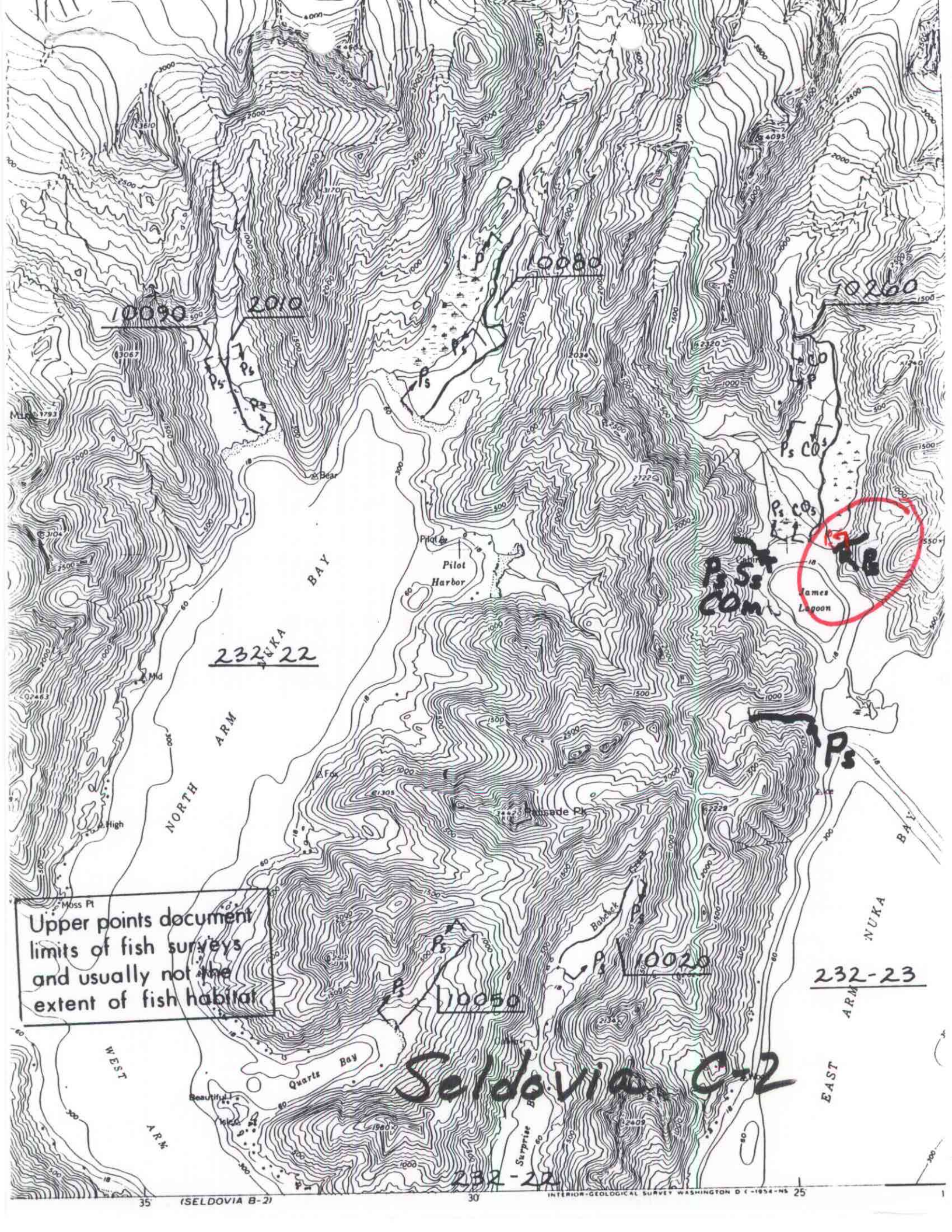

It was a very high tide and difficult to tell where the tributaries were. In the NE corner is a small clearwater tributary that has a waterfall about 150' upstream. We saw a black bear here and counted 42 pinks, with more in the flooded turbid water nearby. The center northern tributary is the largest and is glacial. You had to ~~kick~~ fish to see them (efficiency = 0), counted 3 pinks. There is a clearwater tributary to this fork that we counted 20 pinks in a very short distance. There were a couple of other possible clearwater tributaries on the N & NW sides that had pinks, reds, and silvers in small numbers. Just outside and to the S of James Lagoon entrance is a clearwater tributary (James Mouth Creek) that had 43 pinks at the mouth. The stream at the far end of Midnight Bay has an immediate barrier, & drops off
