EXPLANATION: The Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan stipulates the king salmon sport fish bag and possession limits and any other management measures will be based upon the preseason king salmon abundance index as determined by the Chinook Technical Committee of the Pacific Salmon Commission. The abundance index for the 2014 season is 2.57, which, according to the plan, prescribes that the resident bag limit will be three king salmon 28 inches or greater in length; the nonresident angler bag limit will be one king salmon 28 inches or greater in length, except in May and June the nonresident bag limit will be two king salmon 28 inches or greater in length. The nonresident annual limit will be six king salmon 28 inches or greater in length. In addition, a sport angler may use two rods from October through March.

REGULATION: Consistent with stipulations within 5 AAC 47.055 Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan, the provisions of 5 AAC 47.020 (20) are added by this emergency order and become effective 12:01 A.M. Wednesday April 2, 2014. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective:

5 AAC 47.020 General provisions for seasons and bag, possession, annual, and size limits for the salt waters of the Southeast Alaska Area.

(20) king salmon:

- (A) a sport fish angler may use two rods from October through March;
- (B) the resident bag and possession limit is three king salmon 28 inches or greater in length;
- (C) the nonresident bag and possession limit is one king salmon 28 inches or greater in length, except in May and June the nonresident bag and possession limit is two king salmon 28 inches or greater in length;
- (D) The nonresident annual limit is six king salmon 28 inches or greater in length.

JUSTIFICATION: The Southeast Alaska king salmon sport fishery is managed under the directives of the Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan (5 AAC 47.055). This plan prescribes management measures based upon the preseason abundance index determined by the Chinook Technical Committee of the Pacific Salmon Commission. The preseason abundance index for the 2014 season is 2.57 which equates to 81,353 king salmon allocated to the sport fishery. At this abundance index level, the plan specifies a resident bag limit of three king salmon 28 inches or greater in length; a nonresident bag limit of two king salmon 28 inches or greater in May and June and one king salmon 28 inches or greater in length for the remainder of the year; a nonresident annual limit of six king salmon 28 inches or greater in length; and the opportunity for anglers to use two rods from October through March.
