EXPLANATION:

This emergency order prohibits the filleting, mutilating and de-heading of lingcod, nonpelagic rockfish, and king and coho salmon by marine boat anglers during designated times and areas within Southeast Alaska.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 47.030.(m) are added by this emergency order and become effective at 12:01 a.m. April 27, 2015. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective:

5 AAC 47.030. General Methods, means, and general provisions – Finfish.

(m) In Southeast Alaska, marine boat anglers possessing sport caught lingcod, nonpelagic rockfish, king and coho salmon, and returning to any port on the road system of the communities listed below, during the times designated, may not fillet, mutilate, or de-head these fish until the fish have been offloaded, unless they are preserved or have been consumed on board:

JUSTIFICATION:

The department conducts on-site creel sampling programs in Southeast Alaska to estimate sport fishing effort, harvest, contributions of hatchery and certain wild stocks of king and coho salmon, length and sex composition of lingcod, and length and weight of nonpelagic rockfish. Many anglers fillet, de-head, and process fish before returning to port, which makes it impossible for Fish and Game staff to determine length and sex of lingcod, weight of nonpelagic rockfish or recover tagged heads of king and coho salmon. This results in a diminished ability to estimate the length and sex composition of sport harvested lingcod, estimate average weight of nonpelagic rockfish or contributions of specific king and coho salmon stocks and Alaska hatchery fish to the sport fishery.

The Alaska Board of Fisheries adopted regulations giving the department authority to restrict these activities by emergency order during times and in locations necessary for scientific data collection. These actions are important to fisheries management. This regulation will be in effect for the duration of the creel sampling programs. Anglers returning to these ports still have the ability to consume king salmon, coho salmon, lingcod, and nonpelagic rockfish on board, as well as preserve these fish, if they so choose, before offloading.
