## *Emergency Order*

### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes sport fishing for king salmon in the Ayakulik River drainage. This closure prohibits all sport fishing, including catch-and-release fishing, for king salmon. King salmon may not be possessed or retained; king salmon caught incidentally may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately. In addition, only one unbaited, single-hook, artificial lure may be used in the Ayakulik River drainage. This emergency order is effective from 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, June 1 through 11:59 p.m. Monday, July 25, 2016.

### REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 64.022. Waters; seasons; bag, possession, annual, and size limits; and special provisions for the Kodiak Area. (b)(8) and 5 AAC 64.030. Methods, means, and general provisions – Finfish. (e) are added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective from 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, June 1 through 11:59 p.m. Monday, July 25, 2016.

#### **5 AAC 64.022 Waters; seasons; bag, possession, annual, and size limits; and special provisions for the Kodiak Area.**

(b)(8) in the Ayakulik River drainage, from June 1 through July 25, sport fishing for king salmon is closed. King salmon caught incidentally may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately.

#### **5 AAC 64.030. Methods, means, and general provisions – Finfish.**

(e) Only one unbaited, single-hook, artificial lure may be used in the Ayakulik River.

**JUSTIFICATION:**

The biological escapement goal (BEG) for Ayakulik River king salmon of 4,000 to 7,000 fish has not been achieved since 2012 and has not been met 5 of the last 10 years. Recent poor king salmon productivity statewide and a very low escapement in 2015 in the Ayakulik River justifies closure of the king salmon sport fishery. Additionally, in order to reduce mortality, the use of bait is prohibited and lures are limited to one single-hook, artificial lure within the Ayakulik drainage. Fishing opportunity may be allowed by subsequent emergency order if in-season assessment of the Ayakulik River king salmon run indicates the BEG will be attained.
