# SPORT FISHING Emergency Order

### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order opens the Resurrection River to sport fishing for salmon and increases the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon in the fresh waters downstream from the Seward Highway and downstream from Nash Road to the saltwater markers from three to twelve fish and the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon in the salt waters of Resurrection Bay north of a point from Caines Head to the northern point of Thumbs Cove from six to twelve fish.

# **REGULATION:**

The provisions of 5 AAC 56.122 (9)(D) and 5 AAC 58.022 (b)(3)(A)(ii) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Friday, June 14 through 11:59 p.m. Wednesday, July 31, 2019:

5 AAC 56.122. Special provisions for the seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the Kenai Peninsula Area.

(9)(D) notwithstanding (B) of this paragraph, the waters of the Resurrection River downstream from the Seward Highway and downstream from Nash Road are open to sport fishing for salmon, except king salmon, from June 14- December 31; only single-hook, artificial lures may be used; the bag and possession limit is twelve salmon per day, of which only two may be coho salmon;

5 AAC 58.022. Waters; seasons; bag, possession, annual, and size limits; and special provisions for Cook Inlet - Resurrection Bay Saltwater Area.

(b)(3)(A)(ii) salmon, other than king salmon: bag and possession limit is six fish, of which six per day and in possession may be coho salmon; except that in the marine waters north of a line from Caines Head to the north point of Thumb Cove, the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon is twelve fish:

# **JUSTIFICATION:**

Bear Lake sockeye salmon has a sustainable escapement goal (SEG) of 700 - 8,300 fish and is managed to pass 5,152-12,752 sockeye salmon past the weir at Bear Lake, which meets both the SEG and hatchery broodstock requirements. As of June 11, 2019, more than 11,538 sockeye salmon have passed the Bear Creek Weir, with large numbers of sockeye salmon still entering the river. The upper end of the SEG has been exceeded and the brood goal will be exceeded. To provide additional sport fishing opportunity to harvest sockeye salmon surplus to the escapement goal, as authorized in 5 AAC 75.003 (2)(A), increasing the bag and possession limit is warranted.
