**EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order supersedes Emergency Order 2-KS-7-11-22 issued January 26, 2022, and closes the waters of the Anchor River and Deep Creek to sport fishing.

**REGULATION:**

The provisions of 5 AAC 56.122. (a)(2)(C) and (E) and (a)(5)(C) and (D) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, June 11 through 11:59 p.m. Friday, July 15, 2022:

**5 AAC 56.122. Special provisions for the seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the Kenai Peninsula Area.**

- (a)(2) Anchor River drainage, except the Bridge Creek reservoir:
  - (C) from its mouth upstream to the junction of the North and South Forks sport fishing is closed;
  - (E) from its mouth upstream to the junction of the North and South Forks sport fishing is closed;
- (a)(5) Deep Creek drainage:
  - (C) from its mouth to ADF&G regulatory markers located approximately two miles upstream, sport fishing is closed;
  - (D) from its mouth to ADF&G regulatory markers located approximately two miles upstream, sport fishing is closed;

**JUSTIFICATION:**

As of June 6, 2022, a total of 304 king salmon had been counted in the Anchor River. Based on the 2019–2021 Anchor River king salmon run timing, the 2022 escapement is projected to be less than 2,000 king salmon. Since 2017, an average of 53% of the escapement has been counted during July. The later run timing warrants closing the Anchor River and Deep Creek to sport fishing through July 15. Deep Creek king salmon escapement is not being monitored this year but in past years has shown similar trends to the king salmon run in the Anchor River.
