# **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order increases the hours salmon may be taken by dip net in the personal use fishery at the mouth of the Kenai River. Effective 11:00 p.m. Friday July 21, 2023, salmon may be harvested by dipnetting 24 hours per day.

# **<u>REGULATION</u>**:

The provisions of 5 AAC 77.540(c)(1)(A) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 11:00 p.m. Friday, July 21 through 11:59 p.m. Monday, July 31, 2023:

### 5 AAC 77.540. Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Management Plan.

(c) Salmon may be taken by dip net in the Kenai and Kasilof Rivers as follows:

(1) in the Kenai River, as follows:

(A) from 11:00 p.m. July 21 through 11:59 p.m. July 31, seven days per week, 24 hours per day;

# JUSTIFICATION:

The Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Management Plan stipulates that the department may extend, by emergency order, the Kenai River personal use fishery to 24 hours per day if the department determines that the abundance of the Kenai River late-run sockeye salmon will be greater than 2.3 million fish.

As of July 18, 2023, the department projects the Kenai River sockeye salmon run will exceed 2.3 million fish and anticipates the sustainable escapement goal (750,000 - 1,300,000 sockeye salmon) will be achieved. Therefore, it is warranted to increase the hours salmon may be taken by dip net in the personal use fishery at the mouth of the Kenai River.

# PREVIOUS EMERGENCY ORDERS AFFECTED:

Emergency Order 2-KS-1-40-23 issued Wednesday, July 5, 2023, prohibited the retention of king salmon in the Kenai River personal use dip net fishery. Any king salmon caught incidentally may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately and returned to the water unharmed. This emergency order remains in effect.
