EXPLANATION: This emergency order establishes the bag, possession, annual limits, and other management provisions in the Southeast Alaska king salmon sport fishery for the 2025 season.

REGULATION: Consistent with 5 AAC 47.055. Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management *Plan*, the provisions of 5 AAC 47.020(19) are added by this emergency order and become effective 12:01 a.m. Thursday, April 3, 2025. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective:

5 AAC 47.020. General provisions for seasons and bag, possession, annual, and size limits for the salt waters of the Southeast Alaska Area.

- (19) king salmon:
- (A) the resident bag and possession limit is one king salmon, 28 inches or greater in
- (B) the nonresident bag and possession limit is one king salmon, 28 inches or greater in length;
- (C) the nonresident annual limit is one king salmon, 28 inches or greater in length; a harvest record under 5 AAC 75.006 is required;
- (D) from October 1 through March 31, a resident sport fish angler may use two rods when fishing for king salmon; a person using two rods under this paragraph may only retain salmon.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Southeast Alaska king salmon sport fishery is managed under the directives of the Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan (5 AAC 47.055). This plan provides management prescriptions based upon the allocation to the sport fishery as determined by Allocation of king salmon in the Southeastern Alaska-Yakutat Area (5 AAC 29.060). The allocation to the sport fishery for the 2025 season is 28,264 king salmon. To avoid exceeding the Alaska all-gear catch limit a 2% reduction has been applied to the Alaska all-gear catch limit which results in a management target of 27,700 king salmon for the sport fishery. This emergency order implements the management prescriptions prescribed for resident anglers when the sport allocation is below 34,302 and nonresident regulations have been established to provide an uninterrupted resident sport fishery while not exceeding the sport fish allocation. Inseason adjustments may be necessary to either increase or decrease opportunity in order to achieve but not exceed the sport fish allocation of king salmon.

The additional harvest opportunity for residents only applies within Alaska state waters (0-3 nautical miles from shore). In the waters of the exclusive economic zone, all anglers must comply with the regulations established for nonresident anglers, including those established by this emergency order.

PREVIOUS EMERGENCY ORDERS AFFECTED:

Emergency Order 1-KS-R-30-24 previously establishing resident and nonresident king salmon bag and possession limits and a nonresident king salmon annual limit for the 2024/2025 winter season is superseded by this emergency order.

Emergency Order 1-KS-C-06-25 which established sport fishing regulations for king salmon in areas where Alaska hatchery-produced king salmon will be returning near Petersburg, are unaffected by this emergency order.
