**Effective Date:** 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 4, 2025

**Expiration Date:** 11:59 p.m. Wednesday, December 31, 2025 unless superseded by subsequent emergency order.

**EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order increases the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon in the Situk River from three fish per day and six in possession to six fish per day and twelve in possession.

**REGULATION:**

The provisions of 5 AAC 47.023(b)(8) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order the following provisions are effective from 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 4, 2025, through Wednesday, December 31, 2025:

**5 AAC 47.023. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the freshwaters of the Southeast Alaska Area.**

(b)(8) in the Lost River and Ahrnklin River and all drainages flowing into or between the Lost River and Ahrnklin River, the bag and possession limits for sockeye salmon is a bag limit of three fish and a possession limit of six fish, except that in the Situk River the bag limit is six fish and the possession limit is twelve fish.

**JUSTIFICATION:**

The escapement goal range for sockeye salmon on the Situk River is 30,000 to 70,000 fish. As of June 30, more than 30,000 sockeye salmon have been counted through the Situk River weir. Based on historic run timing, approximately 28% of the sockeye salmon entering the Situk River have passed the weir by this date and escapement is projected to exceed the upper end of the escapement goal range. Consistent with the provisions of 5 AAC 75.003(2)(A), increasing the sockeye salmon bag and possession limits to provide additional harvest opportunity for sport anglers is warranted. The escapement goal will still be achieved even with additional harvest from liberalizing the sport fish bag and possession limit.
