EXPLANATION:

This emergency order increases the bag and possession limits for salmon, other than king salmon, 16 inches or longer, from three per day and six in possession, to six per day and twelve in possession, in the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to an ADF&G regulatory marker located at the outlet of Skilak Lake.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 57.120(4)(A)(iii) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Saturday, August 16 through 11:59 p.m. Wednesday, December 31, 2025.

5 AAC 57.120. General provisions for seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the Kenai River Drainage Area.

- (4) salmon, other than king salmon,
 - (A) 16 inches or greater in length, as follows:

(iii) except as provided in (iv) of this subparagraph, in the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to an ADF&G regulatory marker located at the outlet of Skilak Lake, the bag limit for sockeye, coho, and chum salmon in combination is six fish of which no more than three may be chum salmon and of which no more than two may be coho salmon; possession limit for sockeye, coho and chum salmon is twelve fish of which only six may be chum salmon and of which only two may be coho salmon. In addition, the bag and possession limits for pink salmon is six fish;

JUSTIFICATION:

The Kenai River Late-Run Sockeye Salmon Management Plan stipulates that the department may increase the bag and possession limits, as appropriate, when the department determines that the abundance of late-run Kenai River sockeye salmon exceeds 2,300,000 fish and the sustainable escapement goal (SEG) of 750,000 – 1,300,000 sockeye salmon will be achieved.

As of August 11, 2025, the Kenai River sockeye salmon run has exceeded 2.3 million fish and the SEG has been achieved. Therefore, it is warranted to increase the bag and possession limits for sockeye salmon to six per day and twelve in possession.
