EXPLANATION:

This emergency order increases the bag and possession limit for salmon, other king salmon, 20 inches or greater in length, to 10 fish of which only five may be pink, chum or coho salmon in the Nelson (Sapsuk) River drainage.

REGULATION:


The provisions of 5 AAC 65.022(d)(3) are added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective from 12:01 a.m. Monday, June 30 through 11:59 p.m. Wednesday, December 31, 2025:

5 AAC 65.022. Special provisions for bag, possession, and annual limits, and methods and means in the Alaska Peninsula and Aleutian Islands Area.

- (d) In the Nelson River drainage, upstream from its confluence with the Caribou River,
- (3) the bag and possession limit for salmon, other than king salmon, 20 inches or greater in length, is 10 fish, of which no more than five may be pink, chum, or coho salmon.

JUSTIFICATION:

The biological escapement goal (BEG) for sockeye salmon in the Nelson River drainage is 97,000 to 219,000 fish. Through June 25, 2025, the weir count was 114,917 sockeye salmon. Based on historical run timing, the run is projected to exceed the upper bound of the BEG by a wide margin at this point of the run. Given the strong sockeye salmon run this season and several weeks of the run left, under the authority of AAC 75.003(2)(A), it is warranted to increase the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon to provide additional harvest opportunities for anglers in the Nelson River drainage.
