EXPLANATION:

This emergency order increases the hours salmon may be taken by dip net in the personal use fishery at the mouth of the Kenai River. Effective 11:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 28, 2026, salmon may be harvested by dipnetting 24 hours per day.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 77.540(c)(1)(A) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective 11:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 28 through 11:59 p.m. Friday, July 31, 2026:

5 AAC 77.540. Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Management Plan.

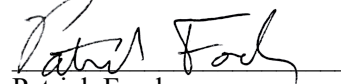
(c) Salmon may be taken by dip net in the Kenai and Kasilof Rivers as follows:

(1) in the Kenai River, as follows:

(A) from 11:00 p.m. July 28 through 11:59 p.m. July 31, seven days per week,
24 hours per day;

JUSTIFICATION:

The *Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Management Plan* (5 AAC 77.540) stipulates that the department may extend the Kenai River personal use fishery to 24 hours per day if the department determines that the abundance of the Kenai River late-run sockeye salmon will be greater than 2.3 million fish. As of July 26, 2026, the department projects the total run for Kenai River sockeye salmon is 3 million fish and anticipates the sustainable escapement goal (750,000 – 1,300,000 sockeye salmon) and the inriver goal range of (1,100,000 – 1,400,000) will be achieved. Therefore, it is warranted to increase the hours salmon may be taken by dip net in the personal use fishery at the mouth of the Kenai River.
